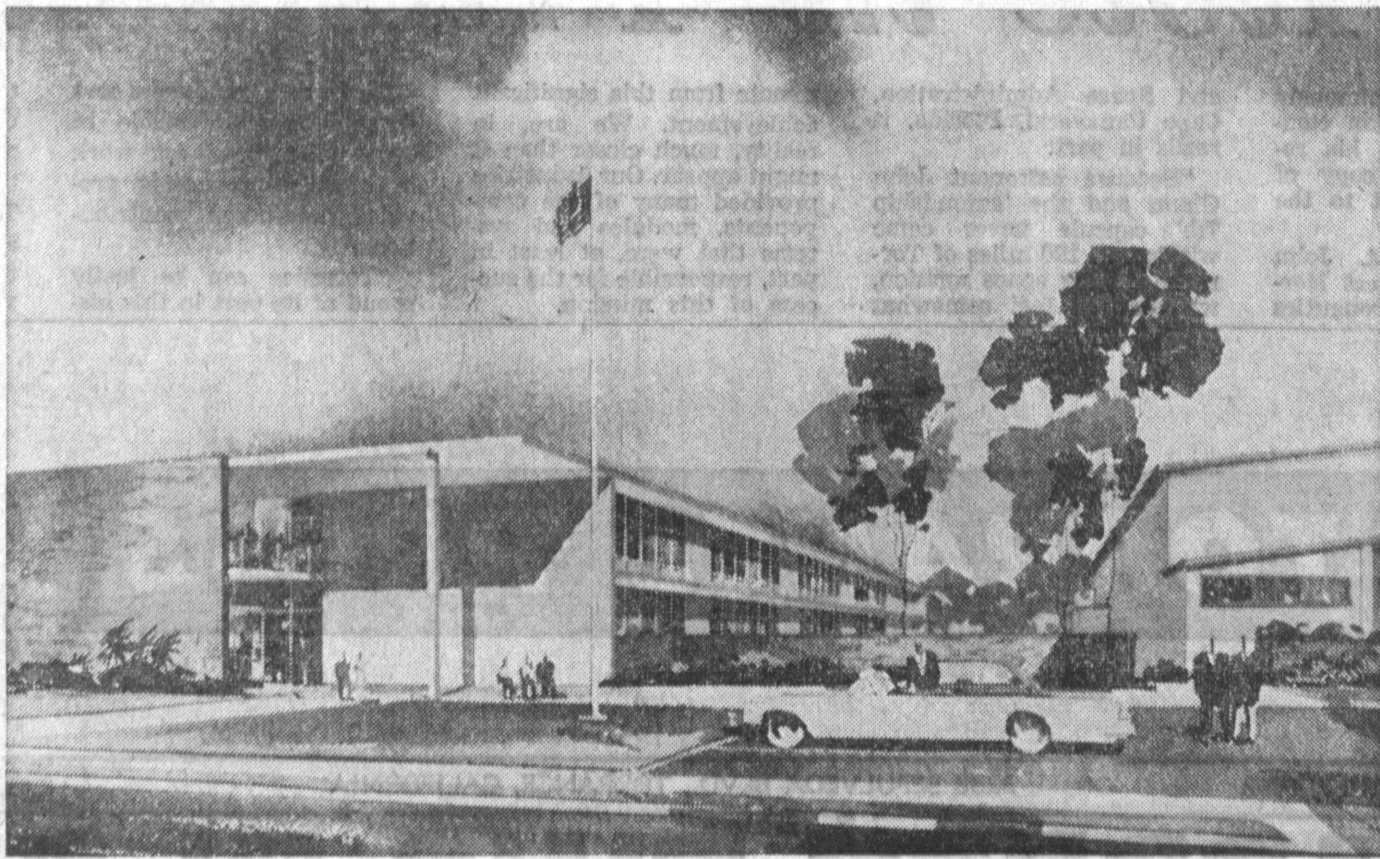

**LOCAL PROJECT** — Design of working drawings and specifications for a two-story \$470,000 classroom building at Carson Street School, 185 E. Carson St., Torrance, is now under way, following approval of preliminary drawings. The new building will have 12 classrooms, administration office unit, library and book room unit, and additional smaller rooms.

### Okay Preliminary Sketches For Carson School Building

Preliminary drawings for a two-story \$470,000 classroom building at Carson Street Elementary School, 185 E. Carson Street, were approved this week, it was announced by Superintendent of Schools Jack P. Crowther.

The new building is being designed by the architectural firm of Andrew Jonich and William Lusby. The firm will have 75 days to complete drawings and specifications for the project and following this, the plans will be forwarded to the State Division of Architecture for further approval.

The new building will include 12 classrooms, an administration office unit, library and bookroom unit, physical education unit, audio-visual room on the second floor, storage room, and sanitary facilities.

Four classrooms will be located on the first floor along with library and administration units, and eight classrooms will be on the second floor. The new building will be connected to the existing cafeteria at the school by a covered walkway.

The superintendent said originally seven classrooms had been scheduled for construction on the site but the continued rapid growth in the area caused school officials to increase the number of classrooms to 12. Funds for the project were approved by district voters in the 1960 school bond building program.

### Local Builder Named to Head Isen's Campaign

Jack Phillips, president of Paramount Builders Supply Co., has been named as the chairman of a city-wide committee formed to campaign for the re-election of Mayor Albert Isen of Torrance, a committee spokesman announced this week.

Polly Watts has accepted the position of committee secretary, filling the same post she held in the mayoralty campaign of 1958.

A fifteen-year resident of Torrance, Phillips has long been active in business and community affairs. He is a member of the board of directors of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, a life member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, past president of the Civitan Club and a member of the Torrance Mounted Police.

### Builders Dedicate PV Tract Streets

Several new local streets in the Palos Verdes area have been completed and have been accepted for maintenance by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Burton W. Chace disclosed this week.

Streets, contained within a new subdivision in unincorporated territory, were constructed by a private developer and add 1.2 miles to the county's system of maintained highways. Completion of the streets involved the construction of pavement, sidewalks, drainage structures, curbs and gutters.

Chace stated that the complete development is located adjacent to Crenshaw Blvd. southerly of Crest Road and contains 67 homesites.

"The street improvements in this tract," he added "have been valued at approximately \$41,000."

Other local streets in the area, completed and accepted for maintenance were constructed by another private developer and add approximately 1.5 miles to the system of maintained highways.

General area contained by the tract boundary lies southerly of Crest Road and easterly of Hawthorne Blvd. and provides for 146 homesites.

"The street improvements in this tract," Supervisor Burton W. Chace pointed out in conclusion, "have been valued at approximately \$213,300."

### Torrance Businessman Candidate For Treasurer

One of the front-running candidates for the post of city treasurer, Fred Spangler, a semi-retired Torrance businessman, this week stated:

"I have become a contender for this post for one reason only. It is a demanding position that requires an excellent background in economics and efficient business administration."

"I feel that the efficient administration of the business of this office will provide a savings for the taxpayers of Torrance and a healthy change in what, over the years, has become a stereotyped position."

Spangler, who is the owner of a sign shop in Torrance and who maintains various other business interests in the community, was educated in Germany where he attended high school and business college. He established and owned a successful manufacturing business in that country until 1939 when he escaped to come to the United States. Studying commercial art and advertising in Nashville, Tennessee, he later founded a sign business in Chicago which he operated until he moved his family to Torrance in 1956.

Spangler, 50, his wife, Henny, daughter, Jane, 18, a student at UCLA, and son, Lee, 16, who attends South High School, make their home at 5210 Carmen St., in the Southwood area of Torrance.

CITY TO CITY

He served as a director of the City to City committee and was committee chairman of the Konya-Torrance program. A delegate who toured Turkey for the city of Torrance, he also headed the committee when Konya city officials visited this community. Spangler also conducted the city schools' poster contest during the program.

Active in the building project of the new Temple Menorah, he served as president of the men's club in 1959, as treasurer of the organization in 1960, and as vice president in 1961.
