## SNOW SCENES

When using color film your camera this winter, try to avoid overexposing sunlit snow scenes. Except when the snow is covered with a glistening crust, such pic-tures need an exposure of about 1/50 second at f/8. Backlighted snow scenes require an exposure of 1/50 econd with a lens opening of f/11. A kodak Skylight filter may be used to relieve the excessive bluishness found in shadow areas.
