Pidgeon Racers Tell Schedule For Two Months

Members of the Harbor Area Racing Pigeon club this week announced the schedule of racing through the month of June.

Ernest J. Chapman, president of the group, stated that the birds will be raced March 25 from Delano, California, a distance of 125 miles; April 1 from Tulare, 150 miles; April 8 from Fresno, 200 miles; April 15 from Merced, 250 miles; April 22 from Modesto, 275 miles; April 29 from Stockton, 300 miles; May 5 from Marysville, 400 miles; May 12 from Red Bluff, 475 miles; May 19 from Redding, 500 miles and from Alpine, Oregon, 700 miles.

On June 9 a special race will be run from Klamath Falls, a distance of 600 miles. All of the races will terminate in the Torrance area.
