

Harvey Aluminum Special Will Compete in 'Indy'

The long, monotonous winning streak of Meyer-Drake Offenhauser engines used on Indianapolis 500 mile race cars is being seriously challenged this year by none other than Mickey Thompson, "Fastest Man on Four Wheels."

Thompson announced today that his "Harvey Aluminum Special" now being readied to enter the Memorial Day speed classic, will be powered by a Buick V-8 aluminum engine.

No Detroit production type engine has won at Indy since 1927, when a Duesenberg took the checkered flag. Last year an underpowered British Cooper Climax attracted considerable attention but failed to best the Offies.

Thompson's experience in squeezing the greatest possible horsepower out of Detroit mass produced engines — his Challenger I set a new world speed record of 406.6 mph at Bonneville in 1960 using four highly modified Detroit V-8's to develop 3,000 h.p. — led him to select the light weight aluminum Buick V-8 powerplant for his streamlined Indy racer.

'CRAZY'

"A lot of people think I'm crazy in using a Detroit engine," Thompson admits. "But I wanted to use something other than the standard Offenhauser and I'm convinced that the three Buick V-8 powered cars I plan to have ready for the race will qualify." Mickey retorted.

The Buick V-8 aluminum engine was picked, Thompson said, because of lightness of weight and durability.

"I've been working on this engine for the past year," Thompson explained. "Most of the modification was done with aluminum parts I've tested and proved in numerous speed trials. I'm automotive consultant for Harvey Aluminum and Harvey has played an important part in the development of both the engine and the chassis components."

The stock aluminum Buick V-8 has been highly modified to increase its rated 185 horsepower to 330 h.p. at 6,500 RPM. Displacement has been increased from the stock 215 cubic inches to the permissible 256 cubic inches. With compression of 14.5 to 1, stroke 3.100 in. bore 3 5/8 in., RMP's 5,000 to 7,500 and a 37.8-1 gear ratio, "The Harvey Aluminum Special" should live up to its sleek, slip-stream design at Indianapolis.

Thompson has extensively track-tested the Buick V-8 aluminum mill during the past year and is convinced it has the lasting power for the long 50 mile grind at the "Brickyard."

He has built his own transmission for the racer—a trans-axle setup mounted behind the rear axle and enclosed in a magnesium housing of his own design. The gearbox will be the two-speed box—long standard at Indianapolis, with the "hot" Buick power plant mounted in the rear behind the driver.

In order to keep up with the pack at Indy, Thompson's car will have to hit 175 mph on the straight-aways and 135 mph in the turns.

Thompson and his hand-picked crew are now rushing three identical racers to completion in time for the qualifying trials in early May.

WARNING SIGNAL

Stain leeching through painted western red cedar siding indicates faulty construction. Staining occurs when unnecessary moisture gets into the siding from behind, dissolving the colored matter in cedar and causing it to stain the paint job. Warrior Grapplers Enter Weekend JC Championship

Undeclared in dual meet competition at the completion of the regular season, El Camino College wrestlers will be grappling for the State Junior College Championship Friday and Saturday, March 9 and 10, at Cerritos Junior College. Wrestling is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. on both days.

El Camino wrestlers completed the last of their dual meets this season by out-grappling Orange Coast College matmen 25-11, culminating the season with a perfect 8-0 record.

Stomping last year's state champion, San Bernardino, 23-8, and this season's UCLA tourney championship team from Bakersfield College, 21-14, the Warriors also recorded impressive victories over Mt. San Antonio College, 21-13; Pierce College, 39-0; Cerritos College, 33-7;

San Diego State Freshman, 22-11, and San Diego City College, 34-3.

FINAL FALL

El Camino 123-pounder Ray Poque put both shoulders of Orange Coast wrestler Denis Strachen on the mat for a fall in 1:50 seconds of the third period.

Wrestling in dual competition for the last time for El Camino, 130-pounder Andy Harris lost to Larry Nissen from Orange Coast, 7-0.

John Arnold, another two-year El Camino wrestler, battled opponent Tom Horton to a 1-1 draw, bringing the team scores to 7-5 in favor of El Camino. Arnold is undefeated in dual meet competition.

Don Holt, another ECC grappler undefeated in dual competition, decisioned 147-pound opponent Don Mat-

son, 4-2. Warrior 157-pound-

er Ralph Freas, substituting for injured El Camino team captain, another second year man Dave Fiorelli, pushed Orange Coast man Larry Jobbins all over the mat before finally pinning him in 2:15 seconds of the second period.

Rick Hansen, at 167 for ECC, lost a close one to Tom Caso, 8-6, in the closing minutes of the individual match. Wrestling in his last dual meet for El Camino, 177-pounder Denny Pointon lost a decision to Jim McMahan 10-4.

The 191-pound weight division match was forfeited to El Camino matman Tim Lutz, who also remains undefeated in dual competi-

tion.

Warrior heavyweight grappler Jim Miller, wrestling in his last dual meet for ECC, pinned Glen Miller, of Orange Coast, firmly to the mat in 1:34 seconds of the second period, making the final score of the meet El Camino 25, Orange Coast 11.
