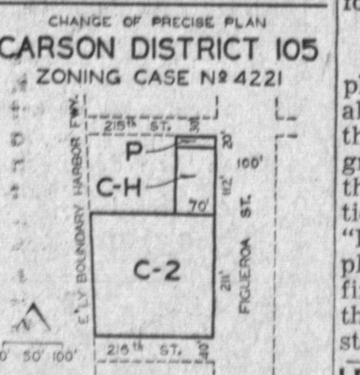

An ordinance amending Section 416 of Ordinance No. 1494, changing regulations for the execution of the Master Plan of Land Use, relating to Carson District No. 105.
The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles do ordain as follows:
Section 1. Section 416 of Ordinance No. 1494, entitled "An ordinance providing for the creation in the unincorporated area of the County of Los Angeles of zones and prescribing area requirements and classes of uses of buildings, structures, improvements and premises in said several zones," adopted September 12, 1957, is amended by amending the map of the Carson District as shown on the map attached hereto.

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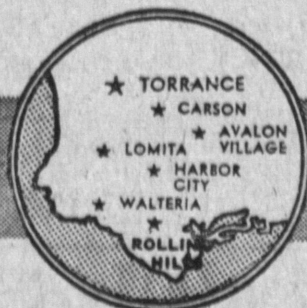
