Youth Employment Office Now Open for Business

Monday, March 5, marked the opening of the new Torrance Youth Employment Service office at the Torrance High School Auditorium. As in the past, the organization is under the official sponsorship of the Torrance Unified School District and the State Department of Employment. The Torrance Junior Women's Club has accepted as one of their many youth philanthropies the responsibility to help with publicity and aid in procuring funds to operate the center.

During the past two summers thousands of Torrance youngsters made application for work as typists, sales clerks, stock boys, delivery boys, bus boys, lawn mowers, baby sitters, yard workers, mother's helpers, car washers and many other jobs. "Over \$14,000 worth of jobs were located last summer," commented Mrs. Rita Baglio, youth coordinator for the State Department of Employment, "but hundreds of these young people went

unemployed because we just didn't have enough jobs to go around."

COMMUNITY HELP

Lysle Albrow, work experience coordinator for the Torrance Schools expressed the hope that the community would "come through with some job opportunities." "There must be hundreds of people in the community who want student help," he said, "the only problem is our finding them—or their finding us!"

Records show that few if any job opportunities are turned down. Students have been known to act as "dog sitters," or "bird bath cleaners" and one student earned quite a tidy sum of money acting as a "bird sitter" with an expectant mother parakeet.

Mrs. Dorothy Becholdt, State Employment Department employee will act as Placement Officer for the new center and will be on duty from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. daily to accept job opportunities and receive applications for work from students of all the high schools in Torrance.
