Trojan starter Larry Fisher opened the game with two balls and from then on dominated EC's batmen, holding them to four hits.

Meanwhile Troy's Frosh shellshocked Lance Valach and Dick King, banging out 14 hits good for seven runs.

Troy's sluggers again went for the distance with catcher Marty Piscovich blasting a 375 foot homer off Valach in the second inning and connecting for two more hits, a double and a single.

Freshman Gary Coscarart smashed a booming four-bagger off hapless Valach in the fifth frame.

Almost every SC batter reflected the training of Trojan coach Rod Dedeaux with the exception of one Jess Dedeaux. The tutor's off-spring went hitless in the two and a half hour SC slugfest.

### WAR DANCE

The Tribe staged a brief war dance in the sixth inning with third baseman John

Ranslem scoring EC's lone tally.

Ranslem reached first base courtesy of SC's second sacker Jess Dedeaux, who miffed Ranslem's breeze-blown pop fly.

With the aid of a passed ball and a safety banged out by left fielder Bob Pier, Ranslem crossed the plate.

Hurler Fisher scattered the Tribe's other three hits with Ranslem slapping a safety in the first, right-fielder Keith Erickson hitting a single in the second and second baseman Bobby Brown banging out a pinch-hit safety in the fifth frame.

El Camino's only exciting moments in this game were provided by third baseman John Ranslem who tried playing superman twice attempting to fly after SC blasts in the hole. He failed both times but brought a pleased smile to EC mentor Chuck Freeman's otherwise gloomy face.

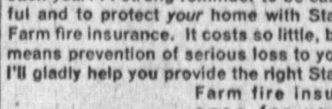

## Warrior Horsehiders Open Metro Season on Tuesday

With a good exhibition season behind them, El Camino College's horsehiders break into a 14-game Metropolitan Conference season opening at East Los Angeles College Tuesday.

Monday, in the closing week of EC's "spring training," the Tribe traveled to USC's Bovard Field and met more than its match.

When the smoke cleared a combined team of SC Trojans and Spartans emerged victorious 10-4.

El Camino had no business losing. The Tribe out-hit SC 8-5, the men from Troy outblundered EC 3-2 and Warrior mound corpsmen whiffed 16 while SC hill men struck out 10.

However, statistics and El Camino fell in defeat.

The problem lay primarily in EC's supposedly dream hill corps. While compiling impressive statistics, hurlers Jerry Smith and Ray Wilson were sneaking walks in. Of the ten SC runs, six started with innocent bases on balls.

### EARLY LEAD

El Camino jumped to an early lead in the third inning on an error on Troy's second sacker Bill Wilford, a safety by pitcher Jerry Smith, a sacrifice bunt by center fielder Joe Moore and a walk to shortstop Bob Withers. Left fielder Bob Pier followed with a two-base blast off the left field screen to drive in two.

El Camino remained quiet until the ninth frame, when

the Tribe tossed in two more runs.

Between the third and ninth, SC stole the limelight to make the game.

SC's Bobby Thompson blasted a solo homer in the fourth to put the Trojan-Spartan combo on the scoreboard.

SC virtually won the game in the fifth inning, when Warrior Jerry Smith's arm went haywire as he issued four consecutive walks to make it a new game.

With the basepaths jammed, SC rightfielder Mike Lotz cleared up the base congestion, unloading a 340-foot blast that cleared the Bovard Field's right field fence by 20 feet.

SC threw salt in the EC wound by knocking Smith's successor, Ray Wilson, around for four runs.

Troy's man of the day, first baseman Thompson, almost smashed the Tribe singlehanded with a second inning double, a fourth inning homer and a seventh frame safety. In the afternoon of baseball he drove in three of SC's ten runs.

EC baseball tutor Chuck Freeman observed Thompson's feats with mixed emotions; Thompson is an EC alum and a grad of the '61 Warrior baseball squad.

## Valley Cops Top Spot, Routing Harbor, El Camino at ELA Relays

Metropolitan Conference track and field teams opened dual competition last Friday after flexing their muscles impressively in the annual East Los Angeles College Relays last week.

Valley, presaging its power for the coming campaign, won the team title with 40 points, 16 ahead of Bakersfield and Long Beach, which tied for second with 24. East Los Angeles scored 22, El Camino 21, San Diego 19, Santa Monica 10 and Harbor 5.

Last year Long Beach won the Relays with 33½ points and went on to cop the conference meet at the end of the dual season.

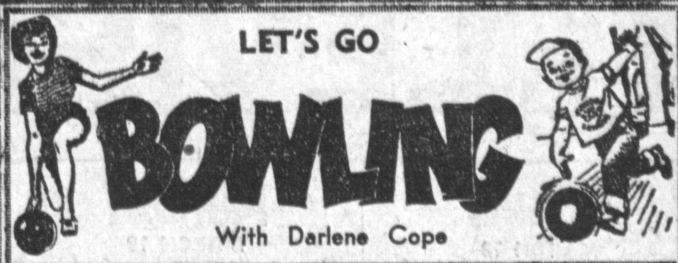
Several records were set in this year's renewal. Weightman Lou Fasano broke a meet and Valley College standard when he lofted the discus 163-11 to head the efforts of a 3-man team which also set an aggregate meet mark of 436-3.

Fasano additionally tossed the shot 50-4.

Long Beach's one-two shot put punch of Bill Pace (54-5½) and Dennis Wynn (53-1) led the Vikings to a 16-pound record with an aggregate of 153-1. The oldmark of 143-¼ also was surpassed by Valley (144-0).

Meanwhile, Ricky Harris soared 6-7¼ as East Los Angeles high jumpers totaled 18-9 to break Harbor's old meet record of 18-½. In other top individual performances, San Diego's Mike Graves vaulted 14-5½ and just missed at 14-9½, a national junior college record height, and Valley's Ron Nickerson broad jumped 23-4¾. East Los Angeles' Randy Tave was next at 23-2½.

In duals this Friday, Harbor invades Valley, San Diego's at Long Beach, East Los Angeles hosts Santa Monica and El Camino travels to Bakersfield.
