Record-Breaking Sales Affained by Grandview

Edward K. Zuckerman and Barney R. Morris, builders, report that 139 homes have been sold at Grandview Palos Verdes since Jan. 1, constituting the biggest first quarter in the peninsula community's history.

The record breaking pace, they said, can be in large part attributed to the prices and terms at The Estates, newest section which puts peninsular living within reach of middle income families.

Estates homes, with inside square footage from 1432 to 1816, are reasonably priced. Built on ocean view terrain near the city of Palos Verdes Estates, they contain three or four bedrooms, family or dining room and two luxurious baths.

ASH CABINETS

Features include wall-to-wall carpeting in living room, dining room, master bedroom, entry hall and hallway, custom-styled fireplace with log lighter valve, a 100 square foot utility room with doors to kitchen and garage, and ash cabinets.

Estates kitchens provide built-in range and oven with illuminated panel, thermostat, timer clock, window and light, plus garbage disposal, hood with exhaust fan and light, and ceramic tile counters and splash in decorator colors. Most kitchens also include a dishwasher.

The Capri and Catalina are three bedroom plans differing in their treatment of the living area. The former features open sweep of living-dining rooms, with exposure to the rear, while the latter places an ash divider, with louvered ash doors, between living and family rooms.

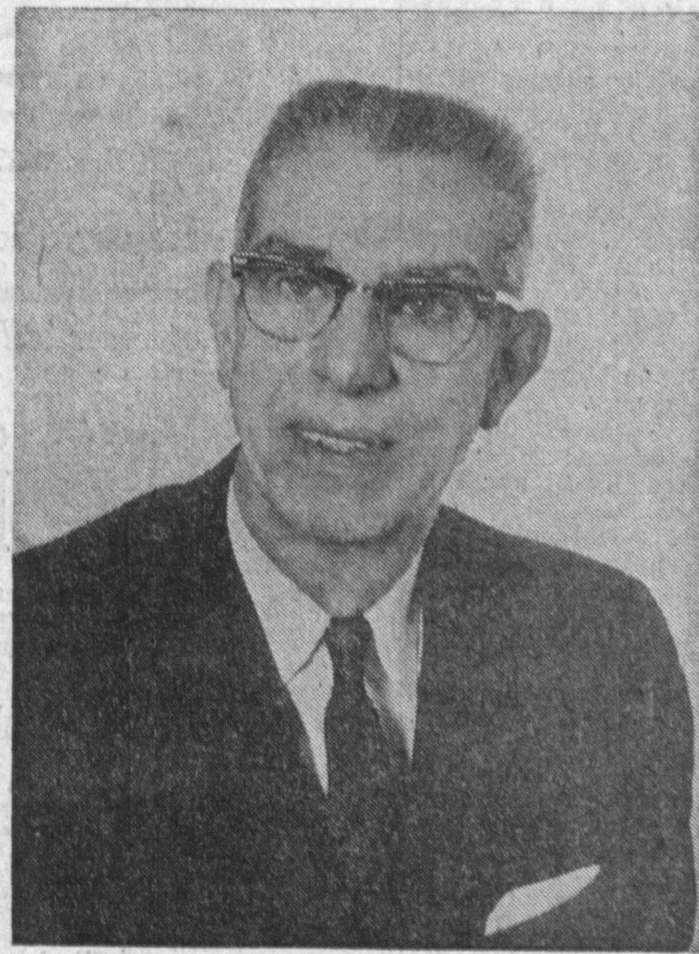
