The Golden Text is from Isaiah (40:8), "The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever."



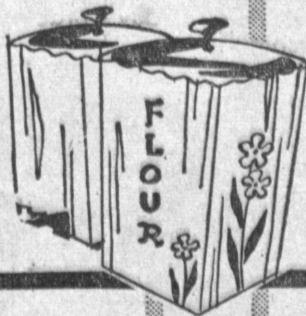
