THIRVIN FLEETWOOD

An active Democrat, member of the city's Planning Commission and the Inter-City Highway Committee, Thirvin D. Fleetwood is one



of the frontrunners in the race for city clerk.

Employed by the Southern California Gas Co., he is treasurer of the North Torrance Democratic Club, past president of the 17th District Democratic Club, past president of the Torrance Democratic Club, and chairman of the Southwest Division of the Utility Workers Ass'n.

He is also a member of the North Torrance Civic Improvement Association, and has served for the past seven years on the Torrance Planning Commission.

BERNARD MILLER



Bernard "Barney" Miller, thirty-nine year old office manager, has said he will devote full time to the office of city clerk if he is

elected. This is Miller's second try for the same post. He filed for the office four years ago, but was disqualified.

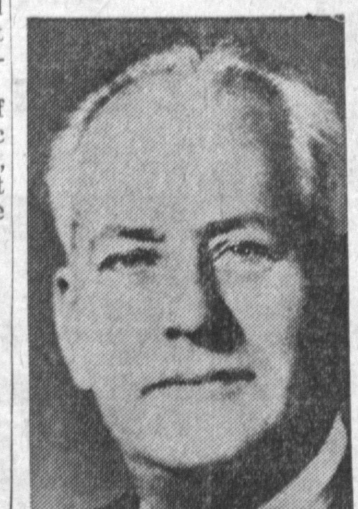
The candidate has been a tax clerk, an account executive, city supervisor, and district manager of MacFadden and Colliers publications. At present, he is a telephone answering service business manager.
