Baptist Church Has Sunday Open House

The new building contains more than 8,200 square feet of classrooms and office space. There will be space for twelve departments, birth through eleven. To provide additional parking a second parking area has been provided on Woodward, just north of the chapel. Other parking space will be made available in the near future to make it convenient for off street parking.

The open house will provide the community an opportunity to enroll for Sunday school.

Adventists Note Ten-Year Growth In Membership

The Seventh-day Adventist church in Southern California has grown in membership by 52.8 percent in the last 10 years, according to a report released by the denomination's Southland headquarters here today.

Alvin G. Munson, Glendale, secretary-treasurer of the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, said the growth figure represents 10,569 baptisms in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties in the 10-year period.

Membership of the Southern California Conference, which comprises the tri-county area, was 14,253 on Dec. 31, 1951, said Munson. At the end of 1961 membership was 21,786, he said.
