

'Near Miss' for Warriors at LBCC Session

El Camino Warriors battled the Long Beach Vikings to the finish line at last weekend's session. After 11 of the 14 events, the score was tied at 49½ points. The results of the next two field events put the meet on ice for the Vikings, and a victory over ECC in the mile relay brought the score to 67½ to 54½.

Habit of the blazing hot day on the Long Beach track was the three-place sweep. El Camino tracksters took the first three spots in the mile and two mile events and Long Beach completely dominated the 220 yard dash and the shot put.

Warriors overpowered the Vikings in the running events, but the perpetual hard-luck story of the season lost the meet in the field events.

Long Beach sprint ace Tim Russell had incredible times in the 100 yard dash (9.5) and the 220 yard dash (20.7), equalling Long Beach school records previously set this year by himself.

El Camino star mile Mike Thornton breezed across the finish line in 4:26.3 with Warrior teammate Richard Fernandez hot on his heels. Fernandez captured the two mile run in 9:55.9.

Oliver picked up a third for the Braves on the parallel bars and Minnie Inouye on the rings. Don Dewey on the horizontal bars and Pete Russell in tumbling also earned the show slot.

Dewey finished the All-Around standings in fourth place, while Oliver took fifth.

Warriors Overcome Early Vike Lead; Win 7 to 6

Friday, in a three-hour contest, the Tribe stole a home game which the Long Beach Vikings thought they had cinched.

Warrior hope dimmed early in the first inning as the LBCC Coach Joe Hicks sent the entire lineup to bat, scoring four.

El Camino's hill ace, Ted Sprague, started the inning and wished he never did.

Viking right fielder Bill Gaynor opened the frame with a walk, third baseman Jim Jenkins followed with an infield single, and second baseman Al Coutts made it 2-0 with a safety after Sprague had pushed the runners along on a wild pitch.

With one man on, Sprague tried to repeat the whole procedure. He walked center fielder Dave Marshall and fed short stop Jim Vickers a fat single-ball for another run.

Here Coach Chuck Freeman tried to call an end to Tribe charity.

Fireman Lance Valatch entered the battle and threw gasoline instead of water. Vike catcher Frank Smith greeted the newcomer with a base rap, making the score 4-0.

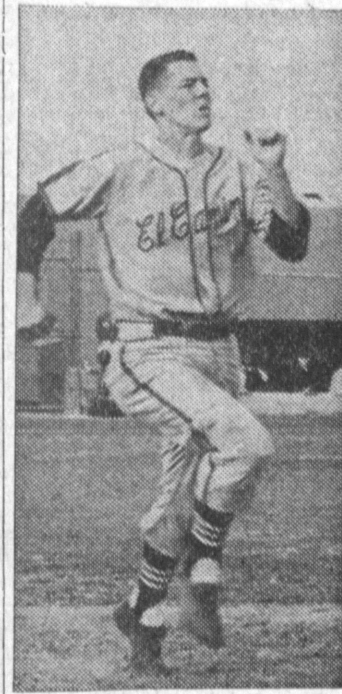
With nothing left to do but look good, Valatch moved down the remaining Norsemen.

From then on Valatch hurled an impressive 6 and two-thirds innings before tiring with two down in the seventh. In his long stint, he gave up one run and that was in the seventh.

The Tribe joined the visitors on the scoreboard in the third.

Ron Schneider opened the inning with a booming 375 foot double. Frank Van Patten bunted his way to first and Bob Withers drove Schneider across with a solid single up the middle.

In the next three innings, it appeared as though Viking ace twirler Rick Bradbury had the Tribe at his

command. In the bottom of the seventh, however, all Warriortville broke loose.

Relief pitcher Steve Parker fooled the Norsemen and played hitter, reaching first base on a fading single to right. Frank Van Patten followed with another distance blow. He drove the spheroid 365 feet, good for a three bagger. Bob Withers, not to be out-done, followed with a booming 380-foot homer.

EC's dugout rocked as Withers brought home the go-ahead run.

The Vikings refused to sit on their hands for the rest of the game. They threw a thorn in the Tribe side when they knotted the contest at 6-6 in the eighth.
