Narbonne Ave. Baptist Church Opens New Building on Easter

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita will enter their new elementary Educational Building on Easter Sunday. The new unit will care for twelve departments of the Sunday school. "It will be a fitting time to use our enlarged building when we will have the greater attendance of Easter Sunday," the pastor Robert A. Wells, stated.

The Nursery department for the smallest child through the three year olds is equipped with the latest equipment to give the maximum care for every need of this age. Included is a combination unit of a stove, sink and refrigerator. Even at this age it is more than "glorified baby sitting" the teaching about God begins.

Other age groups through the eleven year olds will be using the new building. The church offices are also included. The walls, storage cabinets and work space are all finished with natural birch. The office space includes the central secretary offices for the two church secretaries, the office for the minister of music and education and the pastor's study.

Additional parking space has been provided with the entrance on Woodward, just north of the chapel.

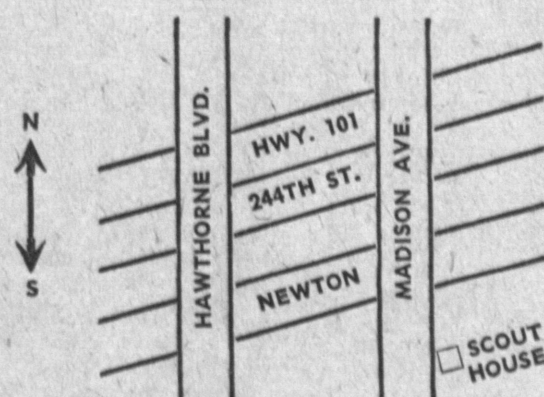
