

Local Residents Take Part In May 11-13 Lasuen Fele

Among the 350 names of workers for the second annual Fermin Lasuen Fiesta announced today by Lee Botich and Mrs. Robert Rados, general chairmen for the May 11, 12, and 13 event Peninsula residents made a strong representation, as well, Lomita, Torrance, and Redondo Beach.

"We have had a wholehearted response from the people of 10 peninsula-harbor and South Bay communities," said Botich, "and what is even more gratifying, we have had dozens of volunteers from friends of Lasuen who do not have sons enrolled but are eager to help the school."

1500 hundred guests are expected for the Mother's Day full course roast beef dinner on Sunday between 1 and 7 p.m. with prompt service assured by Mr. and Mrs. Slavko Frielein and Mrs. Andrew Svornich, co-chairmen. Another Sunday feature of particular interest to teenagers is the Fun House which will be on the Lasuen Plaza grounds from noon until midnight.

According to Mrs. Anthony Demaria, Las Damas booth chairman, hot foods including pizza, hamburgers, tacos, tostados, coffee and cake will be available throughout the Fiesta. Traditional cotton candy, popcorn, snow cones, candy bars and soft drinks of all kinds will also be sold.

Padre Club booth chairmen Richard Haggood and Verne Butcher have lined up 12 exciting skill games with prizes including popular records and stuffed animals. Gay hats, balloons, and windmills will stock the novelty booth.

All of the best loved carnival rides will be on hand with the ferris wheel, merry-go-round, barrel roll, roller coaster, and tilt-a-whirl, ac-

cording to Tom Farrell, chairman.
