Army Pfc. Tone E. Rogers, son of Mr. and Mrs. Tone E. Rogers, 2102 W. 160th St., Torrance, is receiving Hawk guided missile unit training with the 62nd Artillery at Fort Bliss, Tex. The training, conducted by the 1st Guided Missile Group, is scheduled to end May 26.

Under the unit training system, supervisory and maintenance personnel who have received technical training at The Air Defense School at Fort Bliss, joined less skilled personnel to form Rogers' unit. The skilled personnel are acting as instructors, training with the unit as a team.

The training is scheduled to culminate at McGregor Guided Missile Range, N.M., where the 62nd's proficiency will be tested during the firing of Hawk missiles at radio-controlled aerial targets. The Hawk is designed for use against low flying supersonic enemy aircraft.

Rogers, assigned to the group's Headquarters Battery, entered the Army in January 1961 and completed basic training at Fort Ord, Calif.

The 20-year-old soldier is a 1959 graduate of North High School, Torrance, and was employed by J. J. Newberry, Redondo Beach, before entering the Army.

Army Reserve Sergeant First Class Allan E. Richardson, whose wife, Shirley, lives at 2406 W. 180th Pl., Torrance, is scheduled to participate in Exercise Mesa Drive, a two-week joint Army-Air Force training maneuver, at the Yakima (Wash.) Firing Center, May 7-21.

Over 26,000 Army troops and airmen will be engaged in Mesa Drive, the largest joint field training exercise held in the Pacific Northwest. The "Aggressor" force will strike the "friendly" forces in simulated attacks utilizing all types of weapons employed in modern warfare.

Richardson is operations sergeant of the 663rd Engineer Company, an Army Reserve unit which was recalled to active duty and is now located at Fort Ord, Calif.

The 29-year-old sergeant, son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl H. Richardson, 2128 Paseo Del Mar, San Pedro, is a 1951 graduate of George Washington High School in Los Angeles and a 1954 graduate of Los Angeles City College.

Before going on active duty, he was employed by the Los Angeles City Fire Department.

Sweet, 23148 Anza Ave., Torrance, is scheduled to participate with other personnel from the U.S. Army Signal Company Special in Exercise Mesa Drive, a two-week joint Army-Air Force training maneuver, at the Yakima (Wash.) Firing Center, May 7 to 21.
