## Possibility of Governor's Intervention In Billy Romain Smith Case Discussed

The possibility of gubernatorial intervention in the case of Billy Romain Smith, local resident convicted on mutiple charges of kidnapping and assault. appeared yesterday with

Sacramento office. Letter, received by Sharon K. Smith, 18, wife of the defendant, stated,

Gov. Edmond G. Brown's

'In your letter, requesting that the Governor investigate your case to determine whether intervention is justified, you neglected to send pertinent information.

#### EVIDENCE

"You should write to this office setting forth evidence indicating lack of guilt, with special emphasis on any new matter not presented to the jury.

"You should also set forth the nature of the crime, court and sentence. "Upon receipt of this information we will advise

you further." Letter was signed by Arthur L. Alarcon, clemency secretary of Gov. Brown's office.

Request for an appeal was filed with the appellate courts last week by Smith's attorney, Robert. Krause of Long Beach.

Pending the outcome of the appeal it is doubtful that any further steps will be taken to secure intervention by the governor's office.

Smith, who was sentenced to life imprisonment in Long Beach Superior Court, is still being held in Los Angeles Coun-
