Schedule Road Projects for Carson Area

Extension of pavement on the east side of Vermont Ave., south of 223rd St., to join with curb and gutter recently constructed by adjacent property owners, has been authorized by the County Road department, it was disclosed this week by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace said the \$2300 project will improve drainage in the area and reduce roadway maintenance costs on Vermont, which now carries more than 8500 vehicles daily.

Street Light Hearing Slated In Carson Area

A hearing scheduled for 9:30 a.m., May 10, by the County Board of Supervisors may result in 16 street lights for four streets in the Carson area, it was disclosed by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The hearing will be conducted in Room 381 of the Hall of Administration.

Under consideration will be the annexation of a tract to the Dolores Lighting District. The tract consists of Rashdall Ave., Kinard Ave., Nicolle Ave. and 219th St. east of Moneta Ave.

If the Board approves this annexation, five lights will be installed on steel poles on Rashdall Ave., three apices on Kinard Ave. and Nicolle Ave., and two on 219th St. In addition, three more lights will be installed on 219th St. on existing wood poles.

The lights will be installed with overhead wiring by the Southern California Edison Company.
