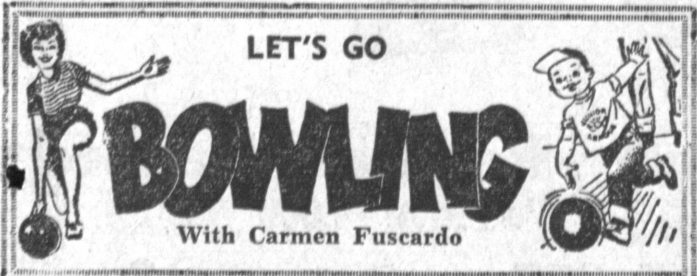

Eight Local Cindermen Attend Fresno Relays

Eight El Camino College track stars competed in the West Coast Relays at Fresno last week, Coach Ray Southstone announced.

Representing the Warriors in the annual event which drew cindermen from leading colleges of the West were Mike Thornton, Richard Fernandez, John Petersen, Richard Dillon, Glen Oclassen, Floyd Schmidt, Dennis Jett and Bob Severance.

The octet participated in the 100-yard dash, one and two-mile relays, the distance medley, the 5000 meter run, the broad jump and the high jump.

Missing first place team honors by 9 2-3 points, El Camino tracksters had to settle for fourth slot in the Metropolitan Conference Championships at Bakersfield recently. Valley finished first with 82 points, followed by Bakersfield with 74 2-3, Long Beach with 74, El Camino with 72 1-3, San Diego with 68, East Los Angeles with 43 1-3, Santa Monica with 19 1/2, and Los Angeles Harbor with 1-6.

Thornton, El Camino ace miler, broke Metro and school records as he sped

through the finish tape in 4:11.6. Teammates John Petersen and Fernandez pushed opponents, placing 5th and 6th. The pace proved too much for the Warrior distance men as only Fernandez could bounce back in the two-mile run, taking second place in 9:48.0.

Severance, Dillon, Oclassen and Jett teamed up to take first place in the mile relay and set a new school record at 3:19.5 for ECC. Floyd Schmidt garnered a first in the broad jump with a leap of 22-10 1/4 for the Warrior cause.

Hurting badly in the field events, El Camino still managed to place eight in either the first, second or third bracket. Jett took a third in the 100 in 10 flat, while Severance placed third in the 880 with a time of 1:55.6. Thornton took the mile, and Fernandez garnered a second in the two-mile run. Jerry Paquila knocked off a third in the 120 high hurdles in 15.6, and Jett doubled to a second in the 220 lows in 24 flat.

A win in the mile relay and Schmidt's first in the broad jump brought the ECC team within 2 1-3 points of second place.

Warriors Place Sixth in Metro Gymnastics Finals

Living up to Coach Don Jurk's predictions, El Camino College doubled past point production in Metropolitan Conference finals but still managed only a sixth-place finish last weekend.

As expected, dual meet champion Valley ran away with team honors, pasting 163 points on the scoreboard. Harbor was second with 26 1/2 points, while Santa Monica (98), Long Beach (84 1/2), East Los Angeles (55 1/2), El Camino (27 1/2) and Bakersfield (7) trailed.
