

Santa Monica Net Squad Cops Title at ECC Meet

Standing off surprisingly strong San Diego, Santa Monica swept into the Metropolitan Conference tennis championship over the week end at El Camino College.

The Corsairs, winners of the circuit dual match title, earned 11 points with San Diego 10; Valley, 6; East Los Angeles, 2; El Camino 1 and Long Beach 0 and Harbor-0 trailing.

Defending champ Marcus Carriedo gave San Diego a big boost by knocking over Santa Monica's Elty Brown, 6-2, 6-4 in the singles final.

Carriedo came back to team with Nick Saxton in the doubles to bowl over Brown and Jerry Collett 6-3, 7-5, in the final round of the doubles competition.

El Camino's top man,

George Blosser, pulled a singles upset, bashing seeded Saxton 7-5, 6-3 in the opening round.

Blosser was in turn knocked out of competition by the Corsair's Steve Myerson, 6-2, 6-4.

In doubles, El Camino felt the sting of upset, as Valley's Nicki Brait and Steve Wayne downed the Tribe duo of Al Benson and Mark Dolansky, 4-6, 6-8, 7-5.

Faring better in the B flight of competition, the Warrior's Jake Guerrero fanned the semifinals only to fall before Sam's Barry Weiss, 10-8, 6-4.

Guerrero teamed with Paul Neives in doubles and also reached the semifinals. The ECC team was knocked out of competition 6-4, 8-6 by Gary Barham and Steve Caplan from Valley.

Two Torrance Students Named Third Place Winners of Awards

Two Torrance students were among the twelve high school seniors named Zone 6 winners in the recent Bank of America statewide Achievement Awards program.

Receiving third place in the Vocational Arts category was Susanna Fordyce of South High School. In the Fine Arts category Steven Lewis Bailey, also of South High School, placed third.

Winners were picked by a judging panel of civic leaders who met the 51 competing students at the Redondo Beach Elks Club, and heard them in group discussion of present day problems related to their studies. Zone 6 includes 19 high schools in the South Bay area and a number of private and parochial schools in the city of Los Angeles.

To get into the competitions the students had al-

ready won certificates, gold trophies, and the honor of representing their schools. Scoring was based on grades, leadership, outside activities and group discussions.

FINALS

The same system will be used in the May 23 finals, when first place winners from all eight county zones take part. Their cash awards will be presented that evening, at a banquet attended by 700 honor students, parents, educators, and prominent citizens.

El Camino Cops Golf Crown

El Camino won the conference golf finals with a narrow 898-900 win over Santa Monica at Encino. San Diego was third (826), Bakersfield fourth (947) and Valley fifth (980). The top three will compete in the state finals at Bakersfield on May 21. Santa Monica's Steve Cooper fired a par 144 to take top individual honors over the 36-hole test. Second was Dave Elder of Long Beach with a 146.

There was a three-way tie—147—necessitating a playoff. El Camino's Steve Halberg won that for third and Larry Sprague grabbed fourth over Santa Monica's Mike Donner. Sixth place finisher was Dennis Drury of El Camino at 148. El Camino's Vance Thomas won the second flight with a total of 144.

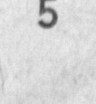
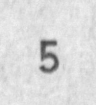
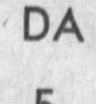
