Winners Receive Awards of Cash

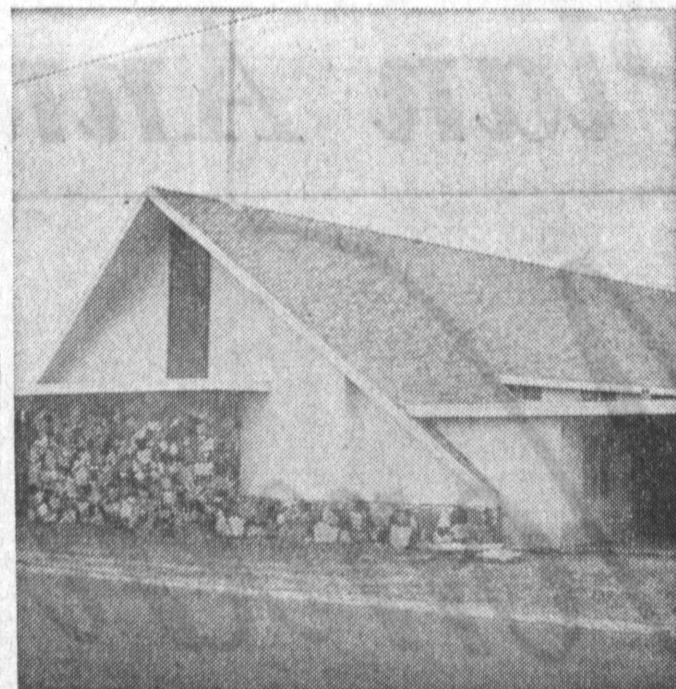

New Fellowship Hall for Del Amo Christian Church, First of Eight Units Will Accommodate 90 Children

The new Del Amo Christian Church will dedicate this modern fellowship hall on Sunday afternoon, May 27, at 3:30 p.m. The dedicatory address will be brought by Prof. T. R. Applebury of Pacific Christian College in Long Beach. The Chapel Choir of Crenshaw Christian Church in Inglewood will bring two selections on the program.

The Fellowship hall is the first unit of an eight unit master plan designed by the Louis S. Gamble & Associates, of Long Beach. The building seats 275 and contains, in addition to the hall, a dining room, kitchen, study, and nursery facilities.

According to the minister, Leslie C. Ashford, the next unit will be a Sunday School unit capable of accommodating 90 children. The public is invited to the dedication

services and to regular Sunday services.

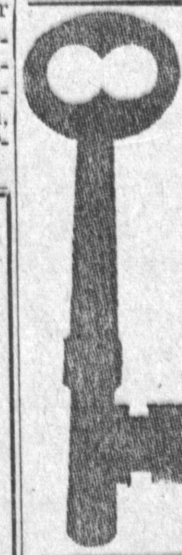
