The overriding qualification, according to Mr. Wise, is that the applicant must demonstrate in his application an understanding of American business and has the ability to explain the principles to employees, customers and stockholders. The District nominees will

now be interviewed by a committee of prominent businessmen for final selection. Mr. Maxwell King, President of Pacific Finance Company and vice president of the Los Angeles area JA Board of Directors is the chairman of the committee.

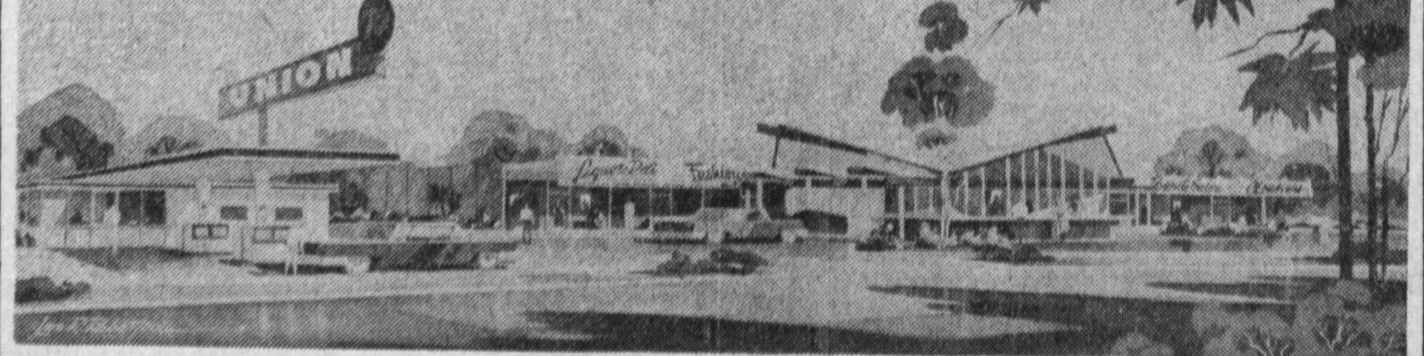

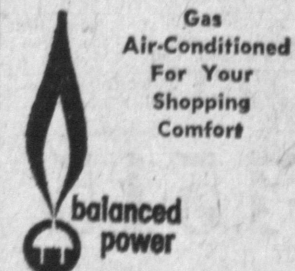
