Two Torrance Riders Will Compete in Cycle Races

A pair of Torrance riders, Bennie Sims and Bob Bailey, will be among the record field of 150 riders expected to compete in Tuesday night's steeplechase motorcycle racing program at Ascot Park in Gardena.

The 15 event program on the rugged nine turn infield course which features a 10 foot jump in front of the grand stand gets under way at 8:30 p.m.

Sims will compete in the expert division while Bailey rides in the novice class.

In the expert ranks Dick Dorresteyn, the national champion from San Pablo and the current Ascot point leader, will try to get back on the win trail after running third in the last steeplechase race earlier this month.

Top contenders include Jack O'Brien, the flat track racing point leader who

scored a clean sweep here on May 6 winning every race. Jimmy Plain, Ed Kretz, Dick Mann, Clark White, Jack Simmons, Dick Hammer, Dave Bostrom, Sid Payne and Skip Van Leeuwen.

Bailey faces a rugged task in the novice ranks for he must face the sensational pair of Eddie Mulder and Guy Louis, who have dominated the novice winner's circle so far with Louis winning three and Mulder the other two main events. Bailey is running in third spot behind the top two in the standings.

Torrance High Adult Classes to Graduate 207 Students

Torrance Evening High School will graduate 207 adults Monday evening, June 11, 1962, at 8 p.m., according to R. E. Collins, principal. Commencement exercises will be held in Torrance High School auditorium. This will be the largest class to graduate from the evening high school since 1953, when the first graduating class, numbering twenty-four, received diplomas. Lyle Albrow, Adult Education consultant, will present the Rev. William K. Schatz of the Seaside Community Evangelical and Reformed Church, who will deliver the commencement address. Joe Wilcox, executive secretary of the Torrance YMCA, will give the invocation and benediction. Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of the Torrance Schools, will accept the class for graduation from Collins. Diplomas will be presented by William Hanson, president of the Board of Education.

1962 class includes people from a variety of vocational occupations, all of whom will have completed their high school education at no small cost in time and effort. Numbered among the graduates are forty-eight veterans of various branches of the armed services; and airlines pilot; several housewives; one married couple, a mother and son; office workers; policemen; a fireman; and industrial workers. They range in age from seventeen to fifty-six, and the average age is 33.6 years.
