councilman Lauds Establishment of New State College

Establishment of a four-year college in this area was hailed as a great boost for the Southwest section of Los Angles County yesterday by Nickolas O. Drale, Torrance City Councilman and candidate for the Democratic nomination as Assemblyman from the 67th District.

"It has taken four years to bring the college from a boards," Drale told backers at a meeting in Gardena. Drale introduced the idea

in the spring of 1958, and was instrumental in the formation of a local committee to press for establishment of a four-year college to serve the fast-growing Gardena, Torrance, South Bay areas.

Assemblyman Charles Chapel of the 46th District got behind Drale's campaign and the 1961 legislature ap-propriated \$5 million to acquire a site in the area for the state's 17th four-yearcollege.

"State officials are now seeking a site for the college. We should learn soon where it is to be located,' Drale said.

ready opened 36 new units in 1962 Launched in 1955, the Mc-


Donald's chain has sold more than 600 million 15cent hamburgers. McDonald's has a unit in Torrance at 17305 Crenshaw.


