LDS Members Give To RC Bloodmobile

Members of the Torrance Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints will sustain their support of the Red Cross blood program Friday, June 1, when they add 165 pints of blood to their group account with the ARC.

The bloodmobile will be stationed at the Torrance Branch, 1880 W. 220th St., Torrance, with collection facilities set up in the recreation room from 2 to 6:30 p.m.

Donors will represent the Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes, Torrance, San Pedro, Wilmington and Lomita wards or congregations which make up the Torrance stake.

Establishment of a blood account began as an individual ward project but interest grew until the over 4,800 members in the Torrance Stake agreed to support the program on a stake-wide basis, according to Roland E. Gagon, 4 Cerritos Pl., Rolling Hills.

Stake President Gagon says, Jim Alcorn of Torrance and Dr. Heber F. Kimball, M. D. of Redondo Beach, are in charge of the LDS blood program account retained by the church members in the South Bay area.

The Mormons here held their first bloodmobile during the Christmas holidays last year and while only about 20 pints of blood have been needed by their members, the Torrance Stake has agreed to annually provide enough donors to meet the quota that can be collected during a day's operation of the mobile unit.

Dr. Kimball and Alcorn say they have reserved the Red Cross bloodmobile for the first Friday in June of each year.

"As a church group we feel supporting the blood program is one of the best contributions we can make in the way of community service," Alcorn explains.

Knowing that by giving blood through the ARC group plan they are providing protection for themselves, their immediate families and fellow church members whenever and wherever blood might be needed, the Mormons in South Bay are also helping those who can't help themselves.

"As a team with Red Cross, groups such as ours supply with no replacement responsibilities, the total blood needs of hemophiliacs and of all patients at such hospitals as Children's, Orthopaedic, Shriners Crippled Children's and all veterans hospitals in the greater Los Angeles area," says Dr. Kimball.
