LA Art Show To Award \$6000

A total of \$6000 for purchase awards in Los Angeles' tenth annual All-City Outdoor Art Festival, one of the largest amounts awarded in any American art competition, was assured for the eighth consecutive year by Home Savings and Loan Assn., it was announced by Kenneth Ross, general manager of the Los Angeles Department of Municipal Art which sponsors the annual event.

Howard Ahmanson, chairman of the board of Home Savings and himself a prominent art collector, guaranteed the awards money which will be used to purchase select art works from a group of 60 items to be chosen by a panel of three jurors prominent in the art world.

The festival is scheduled for three days, June 15 through 17, at the Municipal Art Gallery and grounds of Barnsdall Park located at 4800 Hollywood Blvd. Amateur and professional artists living within a 30-mile radius of the Los Angeles City Hall are eligible to participate in the exhibition. More than 2000 entries are expected for this year's event.

Registration deadline is midnight June 1. Ross said entry forms postmarked later than that time will not be accepted for the festival. Entry forms are available at the Municipal Art Gallery and in room 351 at the Los Angeles City Hall. Forms may also be requested on a postcard addressed to the Department of Municipal Art, Room 351, City Hall, Los Angeles 12.
