## Methodists Will Observe Student Day on Sunday

Most Methodist churches in southern California and Arizona will observe Methodist Student Day on Sunday, June 10, and will give an offering which will be used for scholarships and loans to outstanding students.

In many cases the churches will follow a service of worship prepared by the Division of Higher Education of the Methodist general board of education. Some churches will observe the day on another Sunday.

During the present academic year ten students in churches of the Southern California - Arizona Methodist Conference received National Methodist scholarships, which have a maximum value of \$500, and may be renewed once.

They were among 568 students nationwide who received scholarships of vari-

ous types and amounts totaling more than \$289,000. In addition, 2,701 students borrowed \$858,905, from the Methodist student loan fund. A student may borrow as much as \$2,000, during his educational program.

## Need Vocational Nurses, States Harbor Director

"There is no unemployment among graduates of the vocational nursing program of Los Angeles Harbor College," states Roberta Lindberg, director of vocational nursing at the Wilmington institution. "There are many more job opportunities in the local hospitals and health agencies than there are nurses available."

Requirements for becoming a vocational nurse are, being between 18 and 50 years of age with a tenth grade education or equivalent, and a sincere desire to serve those suffering from illness, or physical or mental disabilities. Other qualifications are that prospective students must make application for admission to the college, and take the entrance examination, followed by a personal interview with a member of the college nursing staff.

The vocational nursing course, which lasts for three semesters, qualifies a graduate to take the state examination to become a licensed vocational nurse.
