Foursquare Church Plans Dedication Of New Home

Dedication of the new Harbor City Foursquare Church, pastored by Rev. Mation Plies, will be held during the week of June 8 through June 17.

Harbor City Foursquare Church began when a group of students from L.I.F.E. Bible College held a tent meeting over 30 years ago. From the tent they moved to a rented store building which they eventually bought and remodeled into a church. Rev. Mation Plies came to Harbor City in 1941. Under her ministry, the church founded Harbor City Christian Day School, which now has an enrollment of 475, with classes ranging from pre-kindergarten through high school.

In 1959 ground breaking ceremonies were held for the new church. Members donated their finances, time and labor over three years and are now realizing their dream. The new edifice, valued at \$200,000, was designed by Joseph Colombo, architect, and is located at 835 West 255th St. It covers over 15,000 square feet, accommodating more than 350 persons with an overflow of an additional 150 seats.

There are 30 classrooms, nursery, kitchen facilities, multi-purpose room, prayer room, offices and a large crusader chapel with a fireplace.

Situated on the hill, the church is visible from all the surrounding area, including the freeway.

In a letter recommending the action, County Flood Control District Chief Engineer M. E. Salsbury told the Supervisors that Charles L. Burch & Sons, Inc. of El Monte completed the drain on May 4.

Two drainage lines were constructed under the contract, Chace noted.

One runs from the intersection of Via Romero and Via Zumaya south in Via Romero and Via Carrillo to Paseo Lunado Canyon and west in right of way through the Canyon to an existing earth channel west of via Anacapa.

The second line begins in Palos Verdes Drive West some 200 feet south of Montemalaga Drive and extends west in right of way through Coronel Canyon to an existing channel west of Paseo del Mar.

Plans for the work were approved by the Supervisors June 13, 1961, and a contract was awarded the Burch firm August 1 of the same year, Chace said.
