Prior to his election as chief-of-staff at South Bay Hospital, Dr. Taylor served as chairman of the surgery department of South Bay Hospital in 1960-61, the first year the hospital was open.

He has served as chief of surgery at Riviera Hospital, Torrance, in 1959-60. The surgeon is a staff member at all major hospitals in the South Bay area.
