Rules for Safety Of Young Fry on Vacation Trips

Three general rules for taking the youngsters on a vacation trip by car — keep them safe, keep them occupied, and tailor your mileage and stops to their eating and sleeping habits — are given by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

How well these rules are followed can spell the difference between a happy motoring vacation and one beset with harassment and unfortunate incidents.

Concerning safety, the Auto Club says children should be seated away from the driver at all times, preferably in the back seat. They should be told not to play with door handles or buttons, or distract the driver in any way and not to stick their heads or arms out the car window.

Keep the child occupied. Variety is essential to keep him from becoming bored and restless. This problem was solved by one mother who took along the three favorite toys of each of her children, and going to the dime store before leaving to pick up a few "surprises" to spring along the way.

Surprises help when the novelty of the trip begins to wear off.

A new jigsaw puzzle, building blocks, coloring sets, crossword puzzles can be time-consuming and educational at the same time. They can be set up atop a suitcase or other hard surface on the back seat.

The Auto Club also advised interspersing the silent play of coloring sets or building blocks with such pastimes as singing with Mom and Dad, counting games involving license plates or roadside signs, or discussions of points of interest along the way.

Stopping to picnic gives everybody a chance to work out car stiffness. Take along a lunch and Thermos filled with appropriate beverage, and let the children try toasting weiners and marshmallows at an outdoor campfire meal.
