3 Bandits Kidnap Man, **Rob Market**

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 27, 1962

Three armed bandits wearing stocking masks kidnapped a grocery manager at his home in Torrance late Monday night, drove to the supermarket where he worked in San Pedro, forced him to open a safe and escaped with an estimated \$20,000. The manager, Lawrence Schropp of 2330 234th St. told Torrance and Los Angeles sheriff's department detectives that he was apprehended by the bandits about 11 p.m. Monday when he was driving his car into his garage after coming home from work.

He said two of the bandits forced him back into his car at gunpoint and drove to the supermarket while a third man followed them in another car.

He said both bandits pointed guns at him all the way to the store and one threatened "I'll kill you if you make a false move." Schropp stated that he was forced to open the safe. He told detectives the ban-dits were in the store for President of Chamber only about 10 minutes.
