

21 Teenagers Leave For Camp Monday

Twenty-one Torrance and Lomita teenagers will be among the more than 150 high school students who will depart via chartered buses Monday for a 5-day "work-play" session at Camp Seely, the High School Red Cross Leadership Training Center in the San Bernardino mountains.

This will be the second of four such sessions which run through July 21 with a total attendance of more than 700 junior and senior high school students from throughout the Los Angeles area expected.

George Post, Torrance-Lomita Red Cross branch chairman, says the delegates from here were chosen by the administrators and faculties of the seven schools they will represent.

County Battalion Chief Issues Reminder on Use of Fireworks

Battalion Chief Paul Schneider issued a reminder that all fireworks, except caps or cap pistols, are prohibited throughout the entire unincorporated area of the county.

"It is unlawful," he said, "for any person to possess, sell, use or explode any fireworks in these areas." "This doesn't apply," the Chief said, "to public displays which require a special permit issued by the Fire Department."

In addition to the unincorporated area, Lawndale, Rolling Hills, and Rolling Hills Estates, all served by the County Fire Department also prohibit all fireworks, except caps and cap pistols.

The Chief explained that the so-called "dangerous" fireworks are not permitted anywhere in the State of California. These include firecrackers, blank cartridges, skyrockets, Roman candles, sparklers more than 10 inches long or 3/4 inch in

diameter, torpedoes, chasers, snakes or other similar devices and explosive type fireworks. It is also a violation of Federal Law to illegally bring these dangerous fireworks into California from other states or foreign nations.

Chief Schneider said that if you wish to enjoy a really safe and sane 4th of July, attend one of the public displays of fireworks in your area. These are conducted by patriotic and civic organizations for a very worthwhile cause. "If you need any further information on your local fireworks regulations, contact your nearest fire station," the Chief said.

The Home Show is confident Lee will last the full nine innings—until closing day July 1.

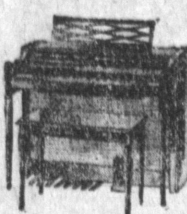
Geologist From ECC Awarded NSF Trip
