

Chapel Theatre Will Present Drama Classes by McNamara

A new phase of Chapel Theatre will begin on the evening of July 6, Friday, when Bob McNamara will explain his method of teaching the art of drawing out the individual's personal reaction to situations on the stage in an effort to further the actor's abilities in performing before audiences.

This will be the start of drama classes, which will be conducted by McNamara at Chapel Theatre, 4164 Pacific Coast Highway, with the first class to be on July 15. During the introductory class McNamara will demonstrate and introduce his method of training.

McNamara's vast knowledge comes from an accumulation of the teachings of the professional training he received from such greats as Herbert Bergoff, Uta Hagen, and Stella Adler all of New York, plus Jeff Corey and Brian Hutton of Hollywood. He is a graduate of drama from San Jose State College where he received his B.A. degree. He has two movies and six TV credits which include "The Naked City," and "The Rifleman," plus New York and Hollywood productions.

As Mr. McNamara stated: "Unlike other artists, the actor has no outside instrument. He has no paint brushes, no musical instruments, no pencils or papers to further his work. He has only himself. A way, or method must be found to bring each actor's instrument (emotions) to the stage. I'm not speaking of the stereotyped emotions that you sometimes see on all stages, I'm speaking of those specific emotions which each actor has that is his alone, and no one else's. He or she must learn that their particular way of showing themselves to audiences in plays is the most rewarding moment for all actors."

"The applause at the end of the play is not as rewarding as the actor feeling the audience believing in him as that particular character which he is portraying. To do this, to make the audience believe, he must know and believe in himself."

Home Savings Accounts to Hit \$1 Billion

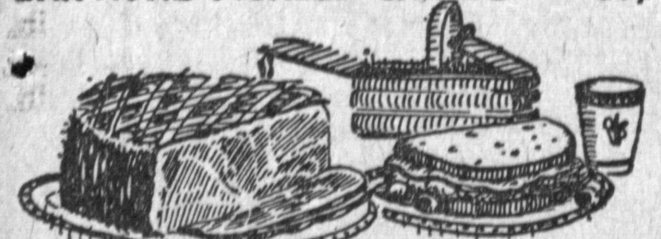

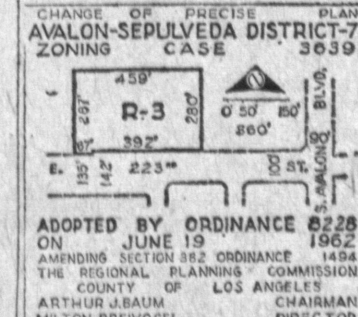
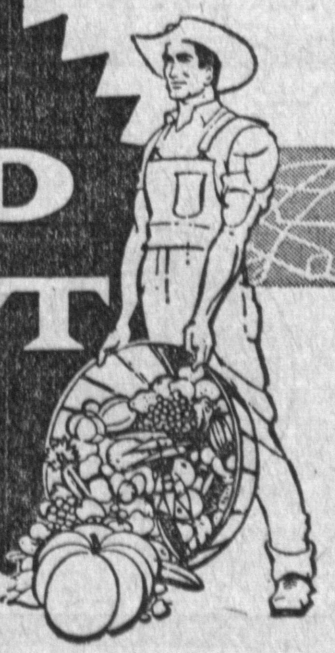
