

Methodist Ministers Receive Appointments at SW Conference

The reading of appointments, an historic Methodist tradition, climaxed a crowded, week-long schedule at the Southern California Arizona Conference of the Methodist Church at the University of Redlands last week.

Appointment changes for 136 Methodist ministers and reappointments for others were announced by Bishop Gerald Kennedy of Los Angeles at the conference's 112th meeting.

A new appointment in this area was that of Harold N. Byrn to the Harbor City church. Re-appointed were: Gilbert S. Zimmerman and associate, Edward D. Goodell, to the First Methodist Church of Torrance; Hans Holborn, Riviera Methodist

Church; and David O. Beadles, Waveria Church.

Total membership in the conference increased to 250,015, a gain of 8,126 persons. And Methodists paid out for all causes \$20.6 million, of which more than 20 per cent (\$4.1 million) went to others.

Throughout the week more than 5,000 persons visited the campus for special events, such as youth day, which attracted 2,600 high school and college young people, largest crowd in conference history.

The conference honored seven retiring ministers, and the memory of 18 ministers and wives of ministers who died during the year.

Finally, in a solemn, impressive ceremony, Bishop Kennedy ordained 46 men to the Christian ministry.
