Award Contracts For Controlling **Air Pollution**

Contracts totaling \$453,734 for services of the Air Pallu-tion Control District to agencies of the state were approved yesterday by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors.

The APCD will charge \$209,000 to test motor vehicle exhaust control devices he State Motor Pollution Control Board and will do research for the State Department of Public Health under a \$244,734 contract These contracts raise the total revenue to the APCD from the other levels of government to \$576,808. Work is ahready in progress on contracts with the U.S. Pub-lic Health Service in conjunction with research intol the effects upon animals of exposure to the atmosphere of the Los Angeles Basin. Projects to be undertaken for the State Department of Public Health include measurements of exhaust and crankcase emissions of American made standard and compact cars, foreign cars, and of truck, as well as environmental chamber studies of eye-irritation and the effect of sunlight on various air pollutants. The work being done for the Motor Pollution Control Board includes the actual testing of control devices submitted to be certified for wide-scale installation under the state program to reduce smog formed from vehicle emissions. The APCD is also obtaining basic data for the State Board.
