Hahn Asks Atomic Group To Make Public Report

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn recently informally asked Chief Administrative Officer L. S. Hollinger to convene the County's Atomic Energy Development and Radiation Protection Committee and report to the public on the effect of atomic tests in the Pacific and in Nevada on Los Angeles County.

Hahn made his request before members of the Board of Supervisors as they prepared to meet on equalization matters late this afternoon.

Members of the Committee are:

Dr. Donald Simonsen, Department of Chemistry, Long Beach State College.

Dr. Harriet Forster, Department of Chemistry, University of Southern California.

Dr. Stafford L. Warren, Vice Chancellor, Health Sciences, Medical Center, University of California.

Dr. Albert W. Bellamy, School of Medicine, University of California.

L. S. Hollinger, chief administrative officer; S. Smith Griswold, Air Pollution Control Officer; Harold W. Kennedy, county counsel; K. H. Sutherland, health officer; Milton Breivogel, director of planning; Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess; K. E. Klinger, forester and fire warden.

"Since we have a committee of experts in this field appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and charged with the duty of keeping

the public informed in radiation protection, this is a logical time for that committee to meet," Hahn said.

Hahn met with Griswold and his Chief Deputy, Louis J. Fuller, prior to calling for the meeting.

PLANS

The Supervisor was informed that the Radiation Protection Committee was formed to: 1. Prepare a factual report on the status of Atomic Energy Development and Radiation protection within Los Angeles County 2. Review and determine the adequacy of regulatory measures currently applied to sources of radio activity by federal, state and local jurisdictions functioning in Los Angeles County 3. Make recommendations on methods to overcome any inadequacies noted in the factual survey and for a general policy to be considered for adoption regarding Atomic Energy Development and Radiation Protection in the County of Los Angeles.

The County Committee has had three meetings since its inception, (Jan. 23, 1961; April 24, 1962, and May 22, 1962.)

NO INCREASES

Hahn was further informed that current nuclear tests conducted in the Christmas Islands have not produced any increases in fallout levels in the Los Angeles area.

The most recent high altitude thremo-nuclear explosion from Johnson Island is not expected to produce any noticeable increase in fallout levels because this device was exploded some 200 miles in outer space, he was informed.

Fuller reported to Hahn, however, that:

"It is possible, though not probable, that we may receive significant amounts of fallout radiation from the tests being conducted at the Nevada test site. Generally speaking the prevailing winds are of such a nature that most of the fallout, if any, from the Nevada tests, can be expected in a general easterly direction."

Of the 6,900 persons who were drowned last year, 3,900 were between the ages of 15 and 64 and most of these were men.
