

## Blind Teenager of Torrance Returns From Tour of U.S.

Torrance's Dale Keen, 15, was among 24 of the most excited children in the United States — if not the world — who arrived back from their 60-day bus trip throughout the United States and Canada recently.

All teenagers from the Foundation for the Junior Blind, they went 9700 miles in their own bus only to have it break down in Las Vegas, Nev., at midnight on their return trip.

"The blind teenagers were practically in tears when they had to leave their bus, which had been their 'Magic Carpet' on the never-to-be-forgotten trip, their bus, which had been donated to the foundation for the junior blind by the employees of North American Aviation, had functioned successfully for most of the trip, but finally collapsed with a major break down, 300 miles from home," according to the foundation.

**QUICK CHANGE**

Mrs. Norman Kaplan, wife of the founder and executive director of the foundation, who was director of the tour, quickly chartered a Greyhound bus and the teenagers and counselors helped transfer their suitcases and luggage to it. They arrived home on "different wheels," but with their hearts filled with the same happiness they had known for two months.

Among the memories of a lifetime the blind children brought home with them were meeting President Kennedy during their White House tour, speedboat rides on the Missouri River, attending rodeos, climbing Plymouth Rock, visiting aboard an aircraft carrier, riding with auto test drivers in Detroit, and "doing New York City."

**'ADVENTURES'**

They heard the thundering roar of Niagara Falls, picked corn in Nebraska, and smelled and tasted the chocolate of Hershey, Penn. They felt the Lincoln Memorial

and felt the warmth of Americans throughout the land.

Their theme song on the trip—and they sang it for their hosts—was "This Land Is Your Land." However, they arrived home singing "California Here I Come."

As Kathy Herrold, 14, of Long Beach, told her parents, "I think I'm the luckiest girl in the world to have been able to see this fabulous country of ours."

**NOTICE OF IMPROVEMENT**  
IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2188-M (225TH STREET, NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT AT ITS MEETING ON THE 28TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1962, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ADOPTED A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION WHICH DECLARED THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD TO ORDER THE ACQUISITION OF THE NECESSARY RIGHTS OF WAY AND TO ORDER WORK TO BE DONE AND IMPROVEMENT MADE, AND THAT ON THE 28TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1962, A "REPORT" CONSISTING OF PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, AN ESTIMATE OF COST, A DIAGRAM, AND PROPOSED ASSESSMENT WAS FILED WITH THE BOARD AND THAT ON THE 28TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1962, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD SETTING THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1962, AT THE HOUR OF 9:30 O'CLOCK A.M., AS THE DAY AND THE HOUR, AND THE HEARING ROOM OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, ROOM 381 HALL OF ADMINISTRATION, 500 WEST TEMPLE STREET (CORNER TEMPLE STREET AND GRAND AVENUE) LOS ANGELES 12, CALIFORNIA, AS THE PLACE, WHEREBY THE BOARD FOR HEARING PROTESTS IN DELATION TO THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT.

The proposed improvement shall include the acquisition of rights of way for road purposes consisting in general of a strip of land 40 feet wide lying 20 feet on each side of the northerly line of the south half of Lot 59, Tract No. 3239, as shown on map recorded in Book 37, Pages 28, 29 of Maps; To be known as 225TH STREET; and the easterly 5 feet of portion within above-described 40-foot strip of land; To be known as MEYLER STREET; together with circular corner cut-offs of 16-foot radius at the intersection of above-described rights of way to be known as 225th Street with above-described rights of way to be known as Meyler Street; and the construction of cement concrete curb, gutter and driveway aprons and driveway aprons including replacement of cement concrete curb and gutter and grading to drain including appurtenant work in MEYLER STREET and THE ABOVE DESCRIBED RIGHTS OF WAY TO BE KNOWN AS MEYLER STREET between a line 40 feet northerly of the northerly line of Lot 59, Tract No. 3239, and a line 50 feet southerly of the southerly line of said Lot 59, and the establishment of the grade of that portion of 225th Street to be acquired and improvement under these proceedings. The curb will be constructed in some locations lower than the elevation now existing at the property line, varying throughout the district from 14 inches above the elevation to 4 inches above.

All of the work or improvements forecast and to be performed as shown on and in accordance with said and to the grades shown on said plans and specifications included in said "Report."

A map of the district, indicating by a boundary line the extent of the territory included in the proposed district, approved by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1962, is on file in the office of the Board. Reference is hereby made to said last mentioned map for a further, full and complete description of the assessment district, and said last mentioned map shall govern for all details as to the extent of the assessment district.

The total estimated cost of the proposed acquisition and improvement is \$27,500.

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PROPOSES TO FIND AND DETERMINE THAT THE PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRE SUCH ACQUISITIONS AND IMPROVEMENT AT THE TIME AND PLACE HEREIN SETTER FOR HEARING OBJECTIONS OR PROTESTS TO THE PROPOSER ACQUISITION, WORK OR IMPROVEMENT A PUBLIC HEARING WILL ALSO BE HELD, PURSUANT TO LOS ANGELES COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 7647, TO HEAR OBJECTIONS OR PROTESTS TO THE MAKING OF SUCH FINDING AND DETERMINATION BY THE BOARD, AFTER SUCH PUBLIC HEARING, IF THE BOARD BY NO LESS THAN A FOUR-FIFTHS VOTE OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF, FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT THE PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRE SUCH ACQUISITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS IT MAY ORDER SUCH ACQUISITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS WITHOUT FURTHER PROCEEDINGS WITH RESPECT TO THE DEBT LIMITATION OR MAJORITY PROTEST PROVISIONS OF DIVISION 4 OF THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

Serial bonds shall be issued in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code (Improvement Code 1911), to represent such assessment of fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more remaining unpaid for thirty (30) days after the date of the recording of the Diagram and Assessment for this improvement. The serial bonds shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the next September 1st following their date.

The principal sum shall become due and payable to the Treasurer in equal annual payments on each October 15th succeeding the September 1st following their date until fully paid.

The first interest payment shall be payable to the Treasurer on the April 15th next succeeding the March 1st or the October 15th next succeeding the September 1st, as the case may be, next following the date of the bonds. The following interest payments shall each be for six months interest and shall be payable to the Treasurer on each fifteenth day of April and October, the last interest payment coming due the October 15th immediately preceding the last annual payment of the principal of the bonds issued to represent the unpaid assessment.

The bonds shall bear interest at a rate to be determined on the sale thereof provided, however, that said rate shall not exceed the maximum rate of 8 per cent per annum.

The proceedings for the aforesaid acquisition, work and improvement shall be under and in accordance with the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California designated and known as Division 12, Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Act of 1915).

Any person interested in, or objecting to said improvement, or the acquisition proposed to be had, or to the work proposed to be done, or to the extent of the assessment district, or to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California designated and known as Division 12, Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Act of 1915).
