Five-month-old William has been a hospital patient most of his brief life, a "guinea pig" for medical explora-

Hospital on June 15, the infant was found to have both hands turned inward and back toward the wrist, plus both thumbs missing, no radius in the right forearm and a radius partially missing in the left forearm,

Objective was to place the right hand in a normal position and transfer the right fibula from the leg to the forearm.
