The local Red Cross organization will join with 15 other branches of the Los Angeles Red Cross Chapter and 18 other chapters in Los Angeles and Orange Counties to make sure there will be blood available over the holidays for everyone who will need it.

"Although the need for blood is just as great over the holidays as at any other time, folks seem to be so busy with their shopping and planning that they may forget for a little while about the sick and injured who continue to need bood to help them in their fight for life," Mrs. Orsini explains.

Since no community blood collections will be held in the area during December Torrance has been invited to participate in a mass bood bank operation Dec. 23 at the Los Angeles ARC Blood Center.

This will be the first time in its peacetime history the Blood Center has opened its doors to blood donors on Sunday, according to Mrs. Orsini.

The 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. collection-just two days before Christmas-will provide an opportunity for individuals in this community "to be a real Santa Claus this year and help give someone his life for Christmas.'

Although this is a peacetime year, Mrs. Orsini said, 'a kind of war for survival will be taking place in our hospitals during Christmas week, when, as always, the sick and injured will need blood to help them in their fight for life.

The chairman said Red Cross hopes to collect enough blood on the 23rd to help meet the need "until things get back to normal again after the first of the year."
