Oilers Drop Apple Bowl Tilt, 26-13

Torrance Peewee Oilers dropped a 26 to 13 Apple Bowl game to the Bellflower Mavericks Saturday night at Bellflower High School.

The game was much closer than the score indicates, as the Oilers gained more yardage than the Mavericks' 312 yards to 272 yards, but the Mavericks defense tightened inside their own 15 yard line.

High spot for the Oilers was a pass interception by Jim Fox, who scooted 35 yards for a touchdown. Oiler quarterback Keith Olson directed the Oilers passing attack hitting Bill Buxton, John Billings, Mike Abrams and Jim Fox for 261 yards.

An Olson to Buxton pass resulted in the second Oiler six pointer.

The rugged defensive Oiler line was led by Jim Modeland, Pete Harney and Paul Kohl. Greg Veach showed good speed in making several nifty tackles from his safety position.

Coach John Sarpolis' Oiler squad had an outstanding record for the '62 season. The Oilers tied for first in the American Peewee League of the South Bay Conference.

It was their outstanding record that resulted in their selection to participate in the Apple Bowl at Bellflower.

Said bonds shall be issued for all unpaid assessments or portions thereof, which amount to fifty dollars (\$50.00) or over, and shall be in the respective amounts as set forth in the assessment for County Improvement No. 2182-M.
