Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles hereby invites sealed proposals or bids for the construction of cement concrete curb, gutter, and driveway aprons, trench pavement, aggregate base, grading to drain and sewerage work, which includes one house lateral sewer) in County Improvement No. 2185-M, 25th Street and other rights of way in accordance with the terms and provisions of the plans and specifications for said improvement.
