"Mary Lou graduated from Torrance High in 1953," continued Mrs. Hutchison.

"Then she went to El Camino College for two years," added her husband, a real estate broker for Clayton Realty, 1008 Crenshaw, Torrance.

"... And got her bachelor's degree from Pepperdine," said the proud mother. Together they explained that Mary Lou became a U.S.-2 in 1957 upon graduating from Pepperdine College. U.S.-2 means that Mary Lou devoted two years to church missionary work in the United States. As a U.S.-2, Mary Lou served at Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg, S.C.

After those two years, Mary Lou taught music at Harwood School, Albuquerque, N.M., which also is under the Women's Division of the Methodist Church.

In 1961, after two years at the school, Mary Lou entered Scarritt to become

a Deaconess. She will be commissioned Jan. 17 in Cincinnati at the Annual Meeting of the Women's Division of the Methodist Church.

The Hutchisons came to Torrance in 1946 from Los Angeles, and their son, Harold E., Jr., is stationed in Germany as a chaplain's assistant in the Army. Mr. Hutchison was born in Illinois, Mrs. Hutchison in Nebraska, and came to California to meet in Los Angeles.

Today, she is on her way back to the midwest to see Mary Lou become a Deaconess.

"It is something Mary Lou has wanted to do since she was twelve," said Mrs. Hutchison, standing in the door of her home on Onrado.

She proudly and happily held in her hands the eight-page pictorial, with red-haired Mary Lou in full color on the front page, that the national family magazine "Together" sent out with a routine press release.

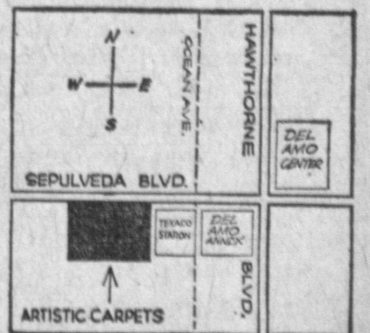
