Showfish of the Month will be the Anabantids or "bubble nest builders." These fish differ from most egg layers in that the male builds a nest of bubbles and takes care of the eggs and newly hatched fry. They are also known as the Labyrinth fish as most are air breathers. The Anabantids include the Betta or Siamise Fighting Fish, the Gouramis, the Paradise fish and the Climbing Perch.

Creighton's Last Reminder; Plates Go Up 10% on Feb. 5

Charles Creighton, manager of the Torrance Department of Motor Vehicles, today issued a reminder to motorists that Monday, Feb. 4, is the deadline for renewing their vehicle registration without penalty.

Creighton advised Torrance area vehicle owners to get their new plates as soon as possible to "avoid being in the long lines that annually jam Department of Motor Vehicle offices during the last days of the renewal period."

A ten percent penalty is charged on all license plates sold after midnight Feb. 4. "A 100 percent penalty is charged on the weight fee portion of each late commercial registration," said Creighton.

The Torrance DMV office will close at 5 p.m. on the last renewal day, but Creighton said that mail renewals which are postmarked before midnight Feb. 4 will be accepted without penalty.
