Best man was Frank Bollinger, John Noone Jr. and John Robbins served as ushers.

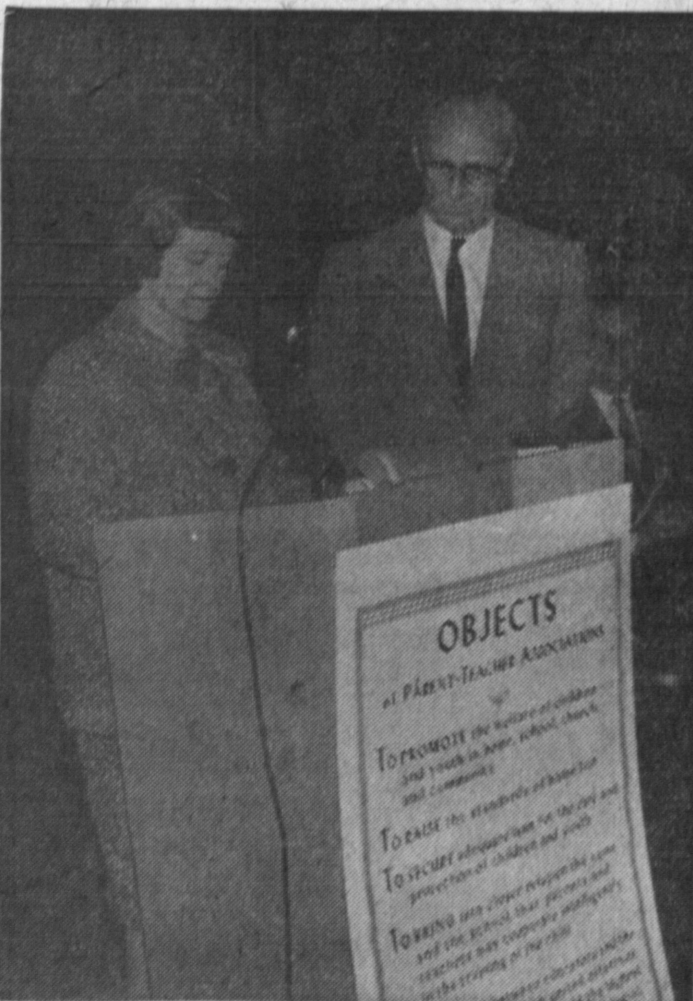
Soloist Mrs. Edward Cuthers was accompanied by Frank O'Neil, organist.

The wedding reception took place at Nativity Parish Hall, Paul Noone presided at the guest book.

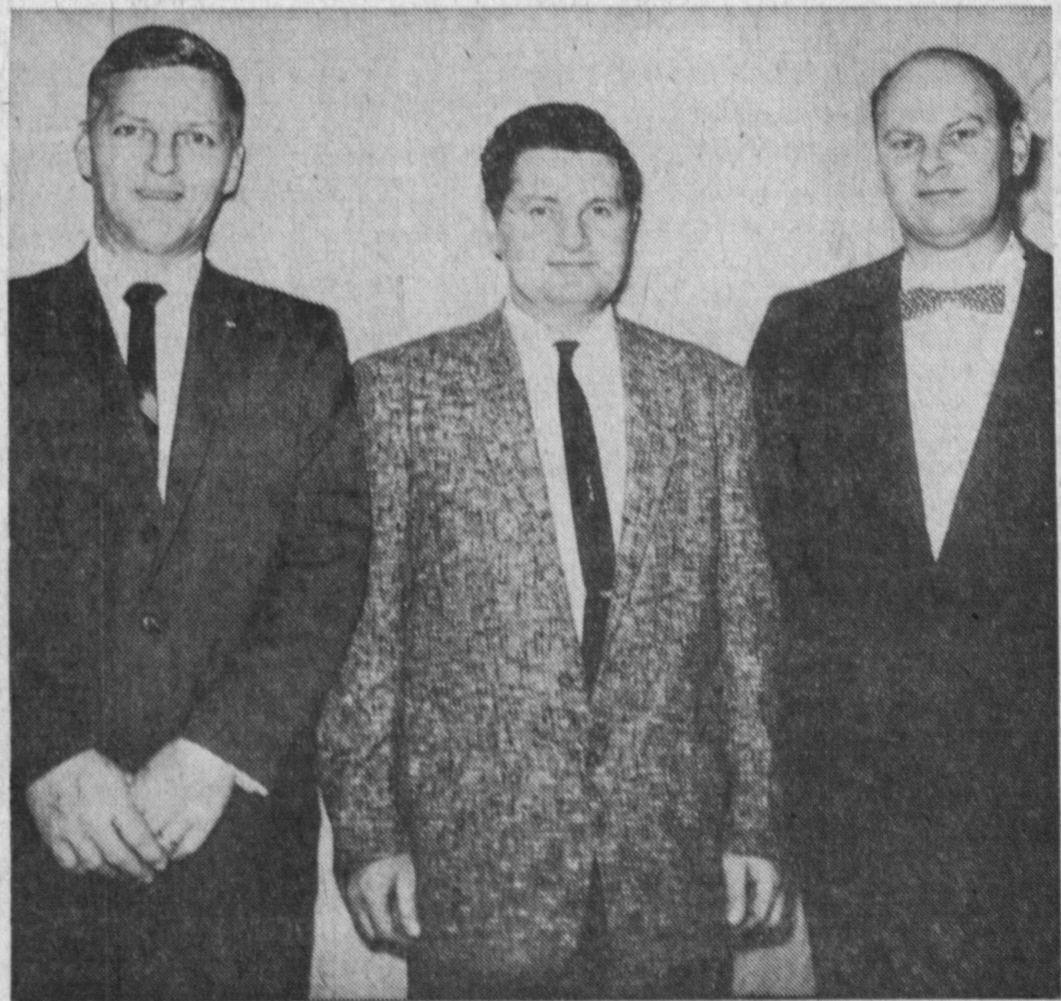
Following a San Bernardino honeymoon, the couple is at home at 361 S. Willard St., San Jose.
