**A Letter to Russia . . .**

**TWO REVOLUTIONS . . .**

(Fifth of a Series)

In 1776, for the first time in human history, a revolution of ideas took place in the United States. The right of men to govern themselves replaced the divine right of kings to rule other men and a chain reaction commenced in this world of ours.

In 1917, as part of that chain reaction, a revolution of men took place in Russia. One set of despotic rulers in your country replaced another.

Today, your country and mine, both the products of revolution, are the two greatest powers on earth. Yet, these revolutionary nations stand violently opposed to each other. Why?

The basic difference between the revolutions which took place in your country, and in mine is the philosophy upon which the men of revolution based their right to end the divine right of kings.

In my country our revolutionaries went back to the natural rights bestowed upon man by his Creator long before there was either a king or a doctrine of divine right proclaimed by man.

On the other hand, in your country, your revolutionaries decided to deny there was a God to bestow a divine right to rule upon a king — a denial that church attendance shows that your people do not accept.

In the U. S., as a result of our revolutionary philosophy, not one person lost his life because of the ideas he held.

In your country, as a result of your revolutionary philosophy, thousands upon thousands were executed because they held ideas "dangerous" to the state.

In my country today, as a result of our revolutionary philosophy, the rights of the individual are protected against the state.

In your country today, as

a result of your revolutionary philosophy, the right of the state is protected against the individual.

Inasmuch as your Russian rulers maintain the right to the state to rule the individual in much the same way as the divine right of kings operated, the ideas contained in our Declaration of Independence against King George III are as dangerous to your rulers as they were to King George.

So long as the ideas of the rights of men to govern themselves are held by an existing government, history teaches your rulers that they are in mortal danger. They cannot feel safe so long as our present form of government in the United States exists.

Your Russian rulers fear those ideas because they are fatal to their denial of those same ideas of freedom. They erected the Iron Curtain to keep those dangerous ideas of the right of all men to govern themselves from infecting your mind, Ivan. That is why your rulers are carrying on a cold war against me. That is why your rulers boast that they will bury us.

Abraham Lincoln said in 1858 that freedom cannot co-exist with slavery. That holds true whether the slaver is in the United States or in the world — whether it is in possession of the body as it was in the United States in 1958, or in possession of the mind as it is today under your present rulers in your country.

In this struggle between the ideas of the United States' philosophy and the God-less denial of those ideas by your rulers, Ivan, the world must either become all free or all slave. That is the only possible outcome. Deep in your heart, which do you prefer? Which is best for you, and for your children?

The consolations of religion, my beloved, can alone

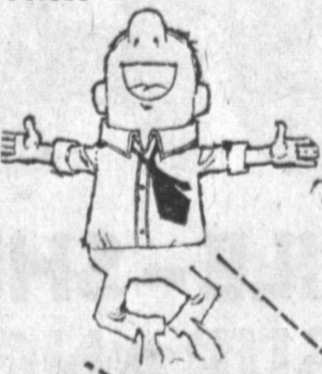
