## Junior Women Slate Talk on School Bonds

S. E. Waldrip, assistant superintendent of business of the Torrance Unified School District, will be guest speaker at a meeting of the Torrance Junior Women's Club to be held at the clubhouse Wednesday evening.

Mr. Waldrip will discuss the forthcoming April bond election. He will provide facts and figures concerning the school district's financial situation, according to Mrs. Jack Bohn, education chairman.

In addition to Mr. Waldrip's talk, the Academy-award-winning documentary filmed during the maiden voyage of the hospital ship S.S. Hope to Southeast Asia will be shown. The teaching-training vessel is now anchored in Salaverry, Peru, where it is bringing modern medical knowledge and skills to the medical profession and the people of that country, according to Mr. Ronald Forrestal, club president.

Project Hope is a privately sponsored program to share America's medical knowledge and skills with the newly developed countries. The ship is a floating medical teaching and training center and the three-

and-a-half million dollars which it takes annually to operate the vessel is contributed by individual Americans, by business and industry, labor, and other contributed by individual Americans, by business and industry, labor, and other organizations, the president pointed out.

This year at the General Federation of Women's Clubs Convention, the Junior Membership voted to support Project Hope on a national scale, Mrs. Forrestal said.

Dr. John Williams of Inglewood will speak after the film and answer questions concerning the project. Torrance Juniors will make a donation of \$100 to Project Hope to help further the work of this worthwhile program, according to Mrs. Forrestal.
