Even if you don't have to serve sea foods to your family during the lenten season, why not plan an excursion into the finer culinary arts of preparing fish?

Fish meals can be among the exotic, exciting adventures in life. This week's fish recipe features fillets cooked in wine sauce.

FILLET OF SOLE AU VIN
Salt and pepper to taste
1 1-pound package frozen fillets of sole
Salt and pepper to taste

- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
- 1 teaspoon chopped green onion
- 1 teaspoon chopped parsley
- 6 small mushrooms, chopped
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 medium stalk celery, chopped
- 1 cup white American wine
- ½ cup bullion or consommé
- 2 tablespoons heavy

cream
Grated Parmesan cheese
Salt and pepper the fillets to taste. Melt butter or margarine in a large skillet and add the next seven ingredients. Lay fillets in the liquid and simmer 5 to 10 minutes. Carefully remove to shallow baking dish, boiling remaining liquid down to about ¾ cups. Add cream and pour the liquid over the fillets in the baking dish. Sprinkle Parmesan cheese on top and bake in a hot oven (450 deg.) for 10 minutes or until lightly browned. (Serves four)

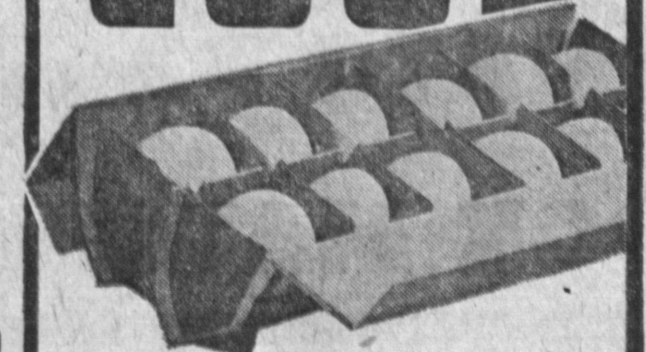
