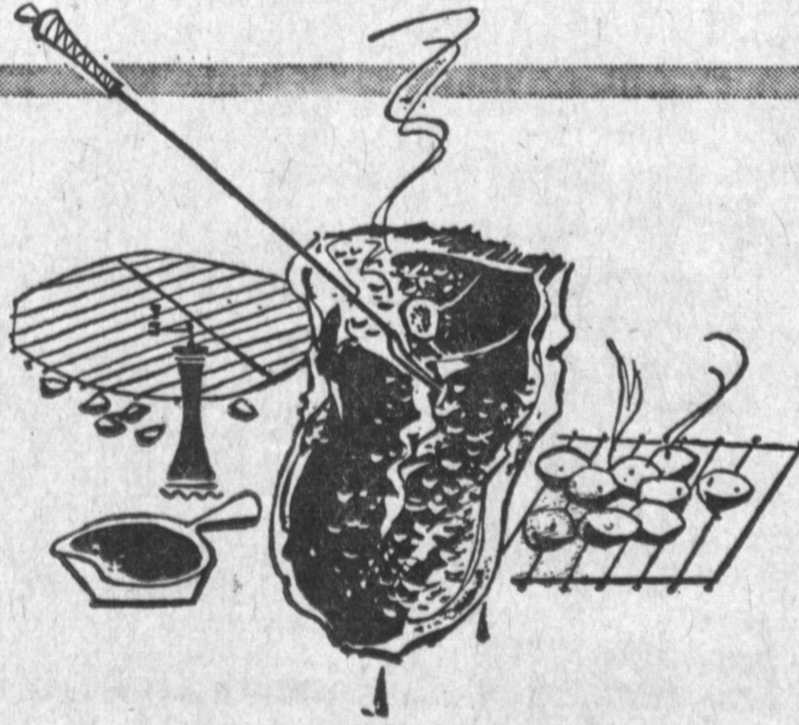

Profile of a Candidate . . .

DR. JOHN McCLURE

John McClure, 433 Via La Selva, resident of district 6 years, M.D. general practitioner, Los Angeles High School, AB. M.D. Stanford University, 2 years graduate study UCLA, Hollywood Riviera Homeowners' Association, Little League, Parent Teachers Association, local medical associations.

1. What would your primary objective be if elected to the board? The objective of board members should be establishment of policies which will lead to the best possible program for students of the district. My primary areas of concern are: (1) Strengthening of reading programs in elementary grades (2) further departmentalization of 7th and 8th grade instruction (3) strengthening of vocational education for students planning to discontinue education at high school graduation, (4) consistent policies on discipline, (5) sound financial expenditures, and (6) policies to attract career teachers to this district.

2. How do you think a school board member can promote improvements in the following areas of education:
 (A) Curriculum. To study curriculum offered to students and through establishment of education policies to direct the administration to strengthen weak areas, for example, more emphasis on reading at the primary level, vocational education for those students not planning to attend college, and strengthened academic education for the future college student.

(B) Obtaining and Retaining a high caliber of teachers. No educational program is better than the teacher in whose trust we place our youth.
 I prefer an inspired teacher in a tent than a dot in an educational palace. The possibility of either merit pay or a better pay scale for master teachers should be studied.

Several present policies should be reversed—the policy of pay raises in October or November rather than September have caused some career teachers to leave to surrounding districts.

(C) Budget Allotments. Budget allotments should be on the basis of actual fiscal needs. (Torrance property owners are taxed \$2.90 per hundred.) I will ask the administration to prepare a study as to what this district should be spending. If more money is needed, I would support an override; if we are spending money unwisely, I would not support a tax increase.

Frankly, I need time to study school finance and am not prepared to make hasty judgements
 (D) Summer School program. In my opinion it is foolish to allow these costly buildings to remain idle much of the school year; therefore, I support a summer school program.
 Summer session can be utilized to help those students deficient in basic skills, to help the average student enrich his educational program, and to help the college minded student take those subjects which he cannot take during the regular session due to the rigid requirements for college entrance.

(E) Special Services School Buses: Re-evaluation of the present school bus policy is needed, especially in those areas which have no sidewalks, and those areas of heavy automobile traffic.
 Recreation: Because of limited recreational space available for the youth of Torrance, I believe that the school grounds should be kept open evenings and weekends.
 Public Use: Schools should be open for public use provided organizations using school rooms should pay for upkeep and that meetings are consistent with our ideals of Americanism.

3. What means do you favor for financing new school construction? New school construction should be financed through long term bonds, approximately the same type of financing utilized to buy a home.
 By using bonds those persons now coming to the Torrance District will be helping to pay for school construction as their children use classroom space.

In addition, I believe this district could more wisely use bond money for equipment actually needed in the educational program rather than spending huge sums for luxurious buildings.
