Janice Mills in Training For Peace Corps Work

Thailand will be the next home of a former Torrance resident, Janice Mills, recently notified of her acceptance in the United States Peace Corps.

Miss Mills is believed to be the first woman graduate of El Camino College to be assigned to a tour of instruction to an underdeveloped country.

Asked why she signed in the Peace Corps, the former college journalism student said, "It's challenging — I want to see what I can do."

Going through training at Indiana University, Janice is specializing in the language, history and customs of Thailand. Refresher courses in United States Government and the U. S. Constitution also are in the curriculum. Daily instruction begins at 7:30 a.m. ends at 9 p.m. Twenty-eight hours of each week are consumed by Thai language classes.

When training is completed, Janice will leave for

Thailand, to live with a local family until she has mastered the Thai language. Then a home of her own

will be assigned to Miss Mills.

Following graduation from El Camino in 1959, Janice continued her studies at Oklahoma Baptist University. On receipt of her bachelor's degree, she went to work in Nashville, Tenn. for a quarterly magazine.

State Colleges 'Expand' for Study in Europe

For the first time, study abroad will be open to students on the 17 campuses of the California State Colleges this fall, under a new program announced by Chancellor Glenn S. Dumke, which will offer overseas study in France, Germany, and Spain to qualified students.

The State Colleges will not establish permanent overseas campuses. The program will use foreign host universities. Use of the facilities of foreign universities is aimed to keep costs at a minimum and allow students maximum exposure to university life in each country.

Among the universities are the University of Aix-en-Provence, the University of Heidelberg, the Free University of Berlin, and the University of Madrid.

Applications from students for overseas study are open until April 19. Applicants must be at least juniors and must pass qualification tests including a high-grade average and proficiency in the language of the host university.

The applicants will be screened by a faculty committee at each campus and by a statewide faculty committee.

Students pay travel, room, board and tuition. A typical program is estimated at \$1020, plus travel and incidentals. A number of fellowships have been offered by French and German universities for student financial aid. Students studying abroad are eligible for National Defense Student Loans up to \$1000 per year.

Approval of foreign universities comes before the Board of Trustees May 9 and 10 at a meeting at Humboldt State College.

A major role in the success of Upland College's varsity basketball team last season was played by Jerry Schipper, a 1960 graduate of South High School.

Jerry helped lead the Spartans to their first winning season in the school's 43-year history with a 13-11 season's slate. The squad also won its first basketball trophy, capturing the Los Angeles Golden State Holiday Tournament. In previous years, Upland had never managed to win more than one game in one season, and that mark only once.

Transferring from El Camino College this year, Jerry compiled a 9.3 scoring mark. For the year he shot a creditable 43 percent from the field to rank fifth and a total of 214 points in 23 games played.

Jerry shot a 65 percent

from the free throw line and made 54 attempts. He added 131 rebounds to finish second in the board department and played at a forward position.
