Dr. Hull's **Bond** Issue

The fact that the coming bond issue will not increase the existing tax rate of the Torrance Unified School District is difficult for many

Perhaps the best way to explain the situation is that it is like a revolving charge account where the minimum monthly payment is not increased by a small ad-

dition to the balance. The reason for this fact is that the district is paying off each year \$2 million of its \$23 million in outstanding bonded indebtedness. The building program requires'about \$2 million per year for the next four years

to keep us off half sessions. The Board of Education simply authorizes the amount needed each year to be sold. Since this is about X equal to the amount paid off, the debt remains about the same and the tax rate does not increase, though it is extended a little longer.

The \$8 million bond issue is expected to keep us out
