

## **Europe Study Deadline Set**

An extension of the deadline for applications to study abroad has been announced by Dr. Thomas P. Lantos, statewide coordinator of the overseas study program of the California State Colleges, who said interested students would be permitted to register until April 30.

The new deadline applies to all three of the programs scheduled to be held in the fall of this year in France, Germany and Spain.

" academic programs offered corsist of two months of advanced language study in the host country, followed by two semesters of selected work in courses relevant to the studen's major and professional objectives.

Minimum requirements are: upper division or graduate standing at the beginning of the current academic year; a high grade point average; and proficiency in the languge to be studied.
